What has been the overall impact of the PE and Sports Premium in 2013 - 2014

- Increased participation for pupils and their families due to increased range of opportunities for developing healthy and active lifestyles. The school has provided memorable experiences which children have responded to enthusiastically. The profile of PE has been raised across the school.
- Staff CPD in Dance means that planning has been improved and teaching points are more accurate in this area. Staff have improved subject knowledge.
- Attainment in PE is similar to previous years. The majority of pupils are working at the expected level in PE by the end of KS1.

How do we intend to spend the PE Premium in 2014 - 2015?

- This year, staff CPD will focus on gymnastics and games teaching
- We will continue to promote exercise and healthy lifestyles and increase participation in sports and physical activity by offering pupils a range of health and fitness workshops, family workshops, lunchtime clubs and events throughout the year.
- Development of the main playground to include greater opportunities for physical exercise for pupils during playtimes and lunchtimes.
- Development of a 3 year strategic plan for PE which outlines how the school will sustain the impact of the PE and Sports Premium funding beyond 2015, including long term impact on pupil attainment and participation.
