I am pleased to list below some of your comments on what you felt we do really well as a school.

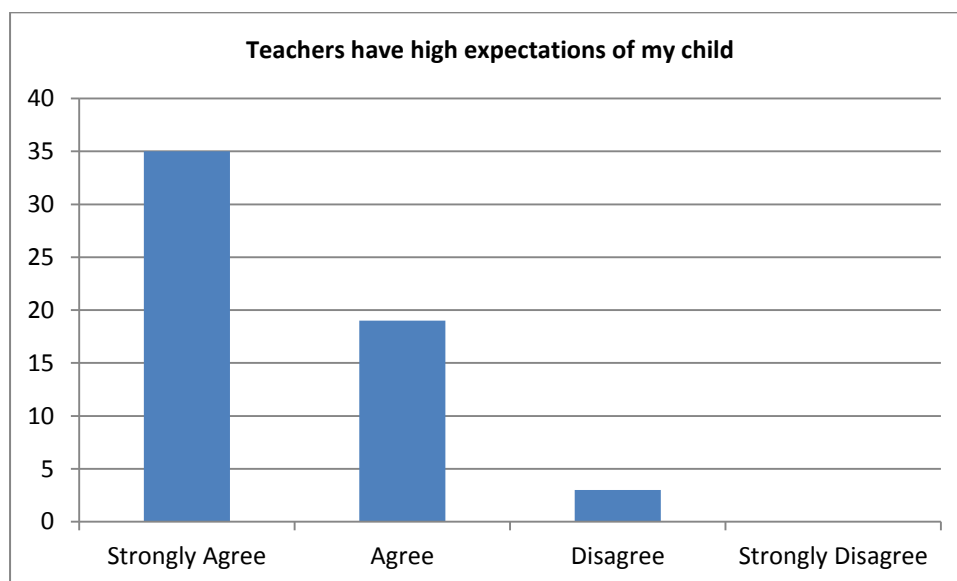
1. Our Christian Values are made very practical for the children's daily lives. The children come home and talk about what they have learned in Collective Worship.
2. You feel that we have excellent, dedicated, approachable and caring staff.
3. You feel the children enjoy learning.
4. Wonderful to see the strong links and relationships with the community and collaboration with local charities.
5. Good communication with parents.
6. Parents feel welcomed.
7. The school is well managed and led.
8. You feel we provide a good curriculum.
9. Excellent focus on child progress and knowledge of each child.
10. A great learning environment with strong moral values and good academic achievement.
11. You feel that good behaviour is an area of strength.
12. You feel we have good parent involvement and take time to listen to any concerns.

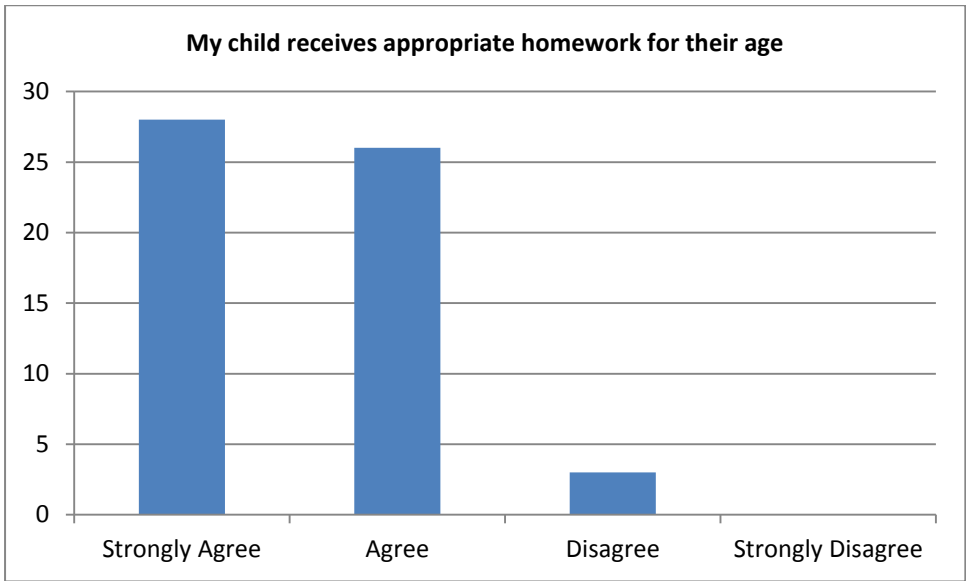
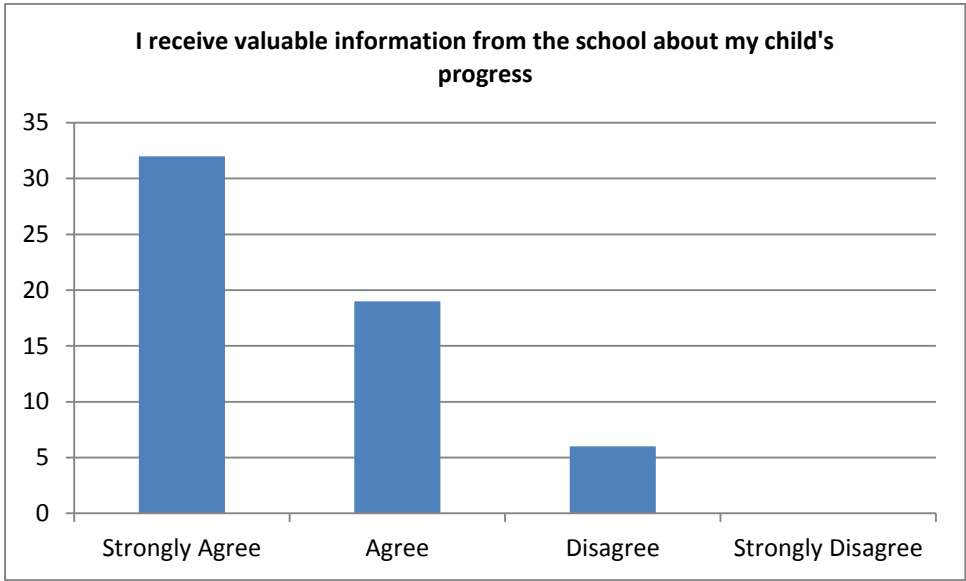
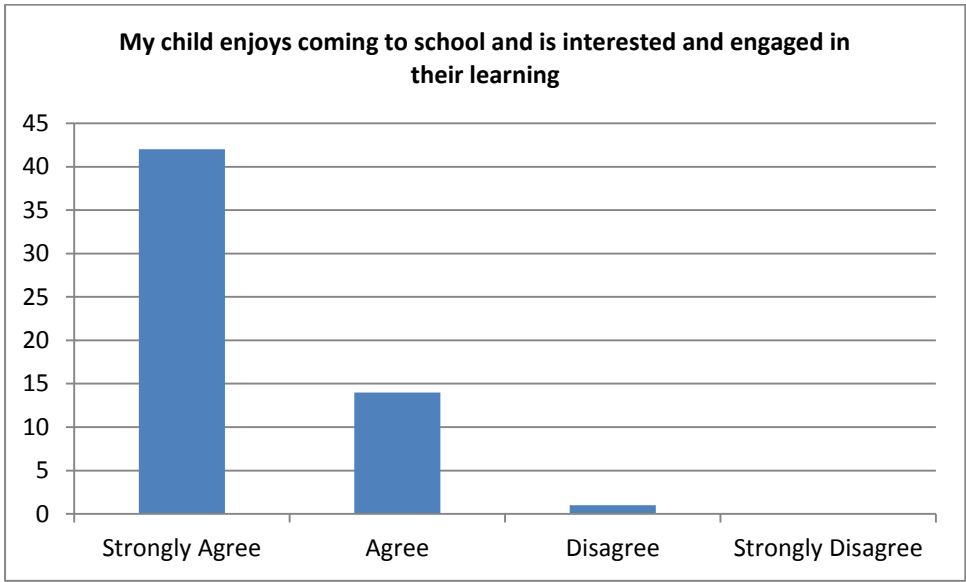
Some of the areas you feel we need to focus on:

Your suggestions for areas to develop and improve.	What we are doing about it.
1. Physical Education	The children undertake two hours of P.E per week with a Fit4fun coach. With the offer of an extracurricular P.E club. Our P.E Co-ordinator is liaising with our local cluster schools to set up a range of inter-school competitions.
2. Progress	A few parents have raised concerns about the information they receive about their child's progress due to the changes in assessment now being the schools responsibility. We held a parents evening to explain the new assessment / progress measures now used in school. At future parents evenings we will ensure that all parents/carers are provided with their child's current and expected progress points for that year.

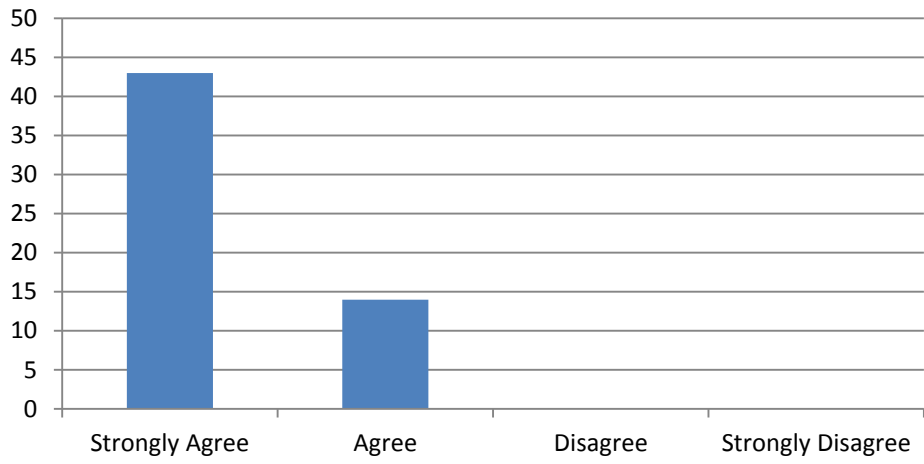
<p>3. Homework</p>	<p>Three parents disagreed that their child receives appropriate homework for their age. This issue was discussed at a parents evening when we introduced our homework books. The parents who attended the evening agreed that the current arrangement of spelling, reading and additional homework as and when required by the class teacher and homework project book is adequate for their children. In Yr6 further homework / revision is encouraged by the class teacher in discussion with the children.</p> <p>We have also purchased Education City. Log ins have been issued to children from Yr1 to Yr6.</p>
<p>4. Bullying</p>	<p>A small minority disagree that the school deals effectively with bullying. Any issues that arise are dealt with initially using Restorative Practice. The Headteacher contacts parents individually to agree positive ways forward. The Headteacher holds a termly parents pop-in session at which no concerns have been raised by parents attending.</p>
<p>5. This school responds well to any concerns I raise.</p>	<p>Three parents disagree that the school responds well to any concerns they raise. The school has an open door policy and the Headteacher is available to speak to parents who wish to raise any concerns that are brought to our attention as promptly as possible. The Headteacher holds a termly parents pop-in session. The school has formal procedures in place should you not be happy with the outcome of any issue you have raised.</p>

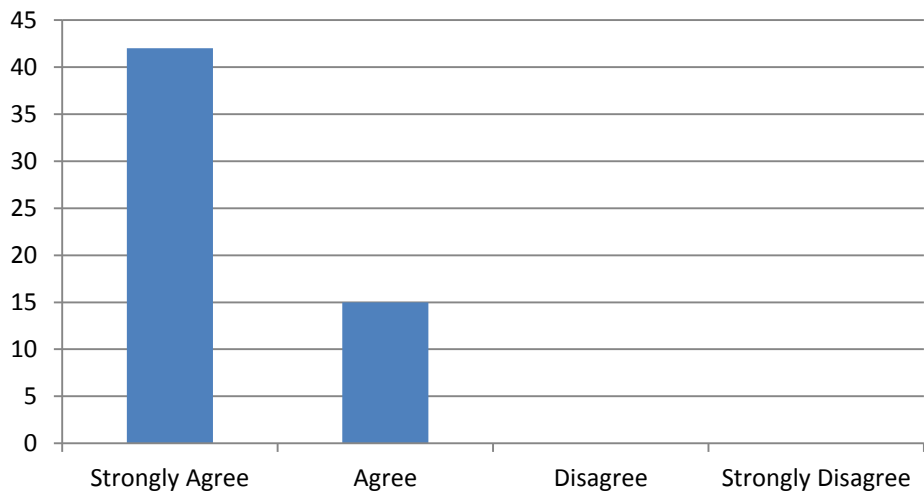




This school is well led and managed by headteacher, governors and teachers
