Aims and Objectives in Spending PPG

- To narrow the gap by addressing inequality and raising the attainment of children who are from disadvantaged backgrounds
- To ensure specific supported programmes are implemented and professional development undertaken to enable quality provision for children requiring intervention.
- To ensure all children are provided with a range of extra-curricular and enrichment activities.

Type of support provided by Pupil Premium Grant

- Additional support from Learning Support assistants in the classroom, small group work and/or intervention programmes (small groups or 1:1).
- Raising pupil self-esteem has a positive impact on pupil progress and attainment. This is achieved through providing enrichment activities for pupils receiving PPG e.g. extra-curricular activities.
- The PPG ensures all children participate in school visits and residential trips

- Breakfast Club – children are invited to attend breakfast club to ensure they get a good start to the day including something to eat and drink.
- New Guided Reading resources have been purchased this year which aims to help all children achieve high levels of reading and writing by the end of KS2.

2014-2015 Pupil Premium Expenditure Impact

How we measure the impact of the PPG spending:

The class teacher and senior leadership team (SLT) monitor and analyse the progress of pupils receiving the PPG using our data tracking system. A pupil progress meeting takes place termly with the Head Teacher. The Special Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO) conducts further pupil progress meetings for SEN pupils and pupils receiving intervention. The progress of these pupils is reported to Governors termly.
