



### Vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium 2016/17

*'All pupils will leave primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.'* (Department for Education)

At Landywood we pride ourselves in the opportunities our children are given to participate in a wide range of physical activities, not only as part of their curriculum lessons but also by the clubs offered both during and after school. We also give them the opportunity to participate in competitive experiences through inter and intra competitions. We feel that is of paramount importance to educate children on making choices in lifestyle and health that they will be able to pass on to future generations.

#### At Landywood we use the money to focus on the following key areas:

- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- Provide broader experiences of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- To increase the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - kick starting healthy active lifestyles.
- Increase participation in competitive sport.

**In 2016/17** Landywood Primary School will receive **£9,140 premium**. The funding is focussing on the following areas to ensure that we support all of our pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and increase their participation and enjoyment in PE.

Internal CPD programme - Level 5 member of staff will team teach and support colleagues in the delivery of PE to improve their confidence and subject knowledge which will improve the quality PE lessons across school.	£1000	Autumn term CPD impact - staff are more confident in the delivery of PE. CPD opportunities identified a weakness in the basic movement skills such as hopping and jumping in Early Years children.
