The children will talk about new characters and environments that they meet during story time.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development



Children are confident to express their own ideas during group times and are beginning to be a lot more independent during play.

Children can specify their wants and needs at snack time and also with toileting.

Children are able to play in a group.

Physical Development



Children are beginning to be independent in dressing and using the toilet.

Children are starting to use a tripod grip to hold writing tools.

Children can copy some letters from their name.

Literacy



Children will begin to recognise initial (beginning) sounds of words.

Children can look at books independently, handling them carefully.

Children can talk about and tell you about the marks that they make.

Once Upon a Time



Spring Term Nursery



This term we will be looking at a variety of fictional characters, including fairy tales and superheroes. We will follow the children's interests and explore other topics such as dinosaurs and space.

We will also be helping the new children to settle into their new class and to learn all of the new rules and routines including joining in with small group times.

Mathematics



Children are able to order objects by length and height, using language to describe, such as long, short, tall, longer, shorter and taller.

We will have a focus on shape this term, including naming and recognising circle, square, rectangle and triangle.

Understanding the World



Children will begin to investigate and experiment with objects, noticing and talking about the things they observe.

We will look at floating and sinking, using different materials, hot and cold and also light and dark,
