



PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT FOR 2016-17- OBJECTIVES, ALLOCATION OF SPENDING AND IMPACT REPORT



In 2016/2017 the Government provided Pupil Premium Funding for all schools.

This funding is based on :

- pupils who are eligible for free school meals or have received free school meals over the last six years
- pupils whose parents work in the armed forces
- any children who have been looked after continuously outside of the family home for more than six months.

It is up to schools how to spend this additional money, but schools are accountable for how they spend it. Part of this accountability is to provide a report to parents on how the funding has been allocated.

Objectives in spending PPG 2016/17

- To ensure that there is a good climate for learning and ALL pupils can succeed
- To further develop the quality of provision, with an emphasis on quality first teaching
- To ensure families access enrichment opportunities to develop social, emotional, and cultural opportunities through wider learning experiences
- To ensure early intervention, by providing dedicated members of staff to teach intervention groups and ensure all monitoring is up to date and acted upon.
- Appoint a senior leadership member of staff as the Pupil Premium Lead.
- Raising attainment and progress so that the difference between their attainment and others in their year group is diminished.
- To further improve behaviour, with a focus on behaviour for learning, and ensure the school reduces pupils barriers to learning by focused. This includes our continuing improvement in attendance and punctuality and embedding the values of resilience, responsibility, respect and collaboration.
