Year 1	<p>Year 1 have had a very busy week. There has been lots of exciting things happening in the classroom. We have had the three little pigs running away from the big bad wolf. They left us a special letter and we made a poster to help capture the wolf. We have enjoyed listening to the story and sequencing our story maps. We have also made character profiles for the three pigs. We will continue with this next week.</p> <p>In Maths we have been working on positions, we have been learning our left and right and positional language. I have sent some homework home linked to this. In RE we are looking at families and celebrations if you have a photograph of your family that your child can bring in and stick in their RE Book I would be really grateful. Also any items related to baptism and photographs of your child's baptism. Can I remind you all to continue reading with your child at home it is really making a difference to their learning. Year 2	<p>What a good week we have had in Year 2! We have finished writing stories for our class books and we are now moving on to a writing topic all about China. In RE we are looking at the miracles of Jesus and talking about how people felt when he helped them. In Science we are studying Life Cycles. We have also had a visit from KS the monkey all of the children really enjoyed his lesson and he will be back to visit us next week! Year 3	<p>Children have been working hard on measurement this week. We have been learning to measure in centimetres and also have spent lots of the week working on converting measures – converting between cm and metres and metres and kilometres. In Literacy we have almost completed writing our own warning stories and children have been working hard on these. We also started to design some Roman shields that we will begin to make next week! On Wednesday, we enjoyed our first swimming session. Children now know how the session is organised and we look forward to developing their swimming and water confidence over the next few weeks. Can we please remind you, if for any reason, your child is unable to take part in swimming, and can we please have a note from home. The same applies if the children are missing PE. Year 4	<p>Year 4 has been very busy this week. In maths, we have finished our work looking at equivalent fractions and the children have a much more secure understanding of this now. We then moved on to simplifying mixed numbers and improper fractions. As with equivalent fractions, the children who know their times tables are finding the work much easier to grasp. Lots of practice of times tables at home and on Mathletics will really help them with the rest of our work on fractions. In literacy, the children completed their conquering the monster tales and I was really impressed with them all; especially the descriptions of their monsters. We have now moved on to writing non-chronological reports. To do this, we are looking at a report on Storm Unicorns and the children are really enjoying it. This week also saw us have two more Kidsafe sessions; one on bullying and one on internet and TV safety. Letters were sent home after each session explaining what we have been up to. Year 5	<p>The children have worked extremely hard this week on their understanding of fractions. We have learnt about equivalent fractions and how to compare fractions by drawing bars – homework is linked to this. In Literacy, we have been looking at features of instructions and this coming week, we will be looking at writing our own set of instructions based on a model. In RE, We will be thinking about the Beatitudes and how they can help us to be inspirational people. On Tuesday, we will be taking part in Safer Internet Day. What's happening this coming week? On Wednesday we welcome the members of our school governing body who are joining us in class for the day. We hope they all enjoy their time with us.

Swimming: The swimming pool is now open so the children from years 3&4 will be swimming on Wednesday's. Please do not forget to send your child's swimming kit to school.

Sunday Mass: We have started to attend Mass on Sunday mornings every other week; Children will be doing the readings and the offertory as well as joining in with the singing. Mrs Nicholas will be checking which children would like to and are able to attend beforehand so that readings can be given out in good time. It is lovely that the children have begun to attend Mass and it is nice that parents come along to support them too. Educational Welfare Officer: We now have a School Educational Welfare Officer, she is Mrs Sue Mallinson and she works for the Furness Catholic Schools, which we are part of. As you know we monitor our school attendance constantly and unfortunately lots of children are falling below our school target of 95%. We do understand that there may be legitimate reasons for the absence such as illness but we do have a duty to promote and pursue good attendance for all pupils. We will be contacting you to let you know if your child's attendance is between 90 - 95% and we will be monitoring it more closely in the future. Parents of children whose attendance falls below 90% will be receiving letters from Mrs Mallinson inviting them to attend a meeting with her and Mrs Nicholas in the near future. We do have a legal responsibility to inform parents when their child's attendance drops below 90%, which is the threshold set by the local authority. Please do contact me if you wish to speak about your child's attendance.

Headlice: We appear to have a problem with headlice at the moment. Please could we ask you to check your child's head regularly - we recommend that you look once a week. There are various lotions available at the local chemists, and the pharmacists are always available for advice and recommendations.

Threadworms: There have been some instances of children having Threadworms. If you think your child has threadworms (your child may have a very itchy bottom at night and may be scratching more; and you can see them in their poo!) please visit the chemist who can give you some medication to treat your family. Please encourage your children to wash their hands after going to the toilet! Thank you.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils. All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

GIRLS UNIFORM

Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.

BOYS UNIFORM

Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.

All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

NO TRAINERS to be worn to school. Thank you.

PE KIT

White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps.

PE KITS & EARRINGS

All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform. Please remove your child's earrings on PE days. And also on Swimming days. Our school policy is that staff does not remove earrings for the children and that a plaster covering the earring is not sufficient. Your child may not be allowed to take part in PE and other sports activities if they do not have the appropriate sports kit or they are wearing earrings which they cannot remove themselves.
