

## HAWKSWORTH CE PRIMARY SCHOOL: PE PREMIUM PLAN 2016/17

The government has provided additional funding of £150 million each year from 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding has again been allocated to schools for the academic year 2016/17 and is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in school.

At Hawksworth, we have developed a provision plan to ensure this funding is invested to enhance the long term impact of our PE provision for pupils and staff.
