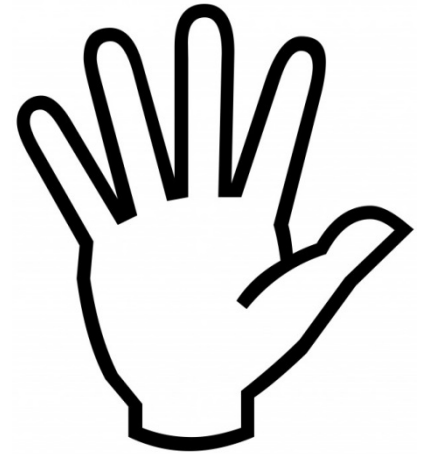
### Anti-bullying Council
