Key performance indicator	Performance standard
 To develop positive attitudes to reading and understanding of what they read. To listen to and discussing a wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks. To use dictionaries to check the meaning of words they have read. To identify themes and conventions in a wide range of books. To read further exception words, noting the unusual correspondences between spelling and sound, and where these occur in the word. Understands what they have read independently. To draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence To predict what might happen from details stated and implied. To retrieve and record information from non-fiction. To prepare poems to read aloud. 	By the end of Y3 a child should be able to justify their views about books written at an age-appropriate interest level A child is able to read the book accurately and at a speed that is sufficient for them to focus on understanding what they read rather than on decoding individual words A child can: decode most new words outside the spoken vocabulary; read longer words with support and test out different pronunciations; recognise themes in what they read, such as the triumph of good over evil or the use of magical devices in fairy stories and folk tales; listen attentively and discuss books and authors that they might not choose themselves; read, reread and rehearse a variety of texts; use contents pages and indexes to locate information; and respond to guidance about the kinds of explanations and questions that are expected from them.
