

How Mary Swanwick Teach British Values – A Provision Map

Children at Mary Swanwick Primary School learn about the fundamental British Values of respect, tolerance, individual liberty, law and order and democracy through a range of different learning opportunities – through SMSC provision (Social, Moral, Spiritual & Cultural) specially planned days and activities, assemblies, circle time and topic work. Teachers plan activities throughout the year, but also deliver an understanding of British Values through learning about current affairs as they unfold.
