<u>Charles Baines (M.B.E)</u> <u>1883—1962</u>

Charles Baines was born at Thorney in 1883, but moved to Gainsborough when he was a few months old. He was a Boiler Maker by trade and worked at Marshalls for all of his working life, during the First World War he served in the Royal Engineers.

He married Nelly Green and with their 4 children (3 sons and a daughter) they settled in Birrell Street, Gainsborough. The school maintains links with the Baines family, a link we are very proud to have.

Charles Baines was always very public minded, working tirelessly to help others. He served on the Gainsborough Urban District Council and was its Chairman on two occasions. It was for this work that he was awarded the M.B.E an honour he was very proud to receive and yet he remained a very modest man throughout his life. He also served on the Governing Body of Ropery Road School (now North County) taking a keen interest in ensuring that the children there received the best education possible. He also was instrumental in much of the development of the Ennis Estate. When he died in 1962 Gainsborough lost an important public figure, this school was built and named in his memory in 1969.

It is with great pride and honour that we endeavour to carry on with that interest in and care for, the children in our care.

ILLNESS/ACCIDENT/FIRST AID

We are not able to supervise children who feel poorly in school and so parents or designated adults will be contacted if necessary. Minor cuts and grazes are treated by members of staff. MEDICINES

Please do not send tablets or medicines to school. If medication is required, please make arrangements to visit school in order to administer this. In the event of long term medication being required, please discuss this with the Head Teacher. Inhalers should be named and given to class teachers who will ensure that your child has direct access to it at all times. For further information, refer to the schools' Managing Medicines in School Policy, which is held in the school office.

JEWELLERY / PERSONAL PROPERTY

One small pair of studs through pierced lower earlobes are considered acceptable. Watches may be worn at school by children as they encourage the learning of time skills. Other accessories need to be worn with the utmost discretion and we expect parents to use common sense and safety as their guidelines. Children are responsible for their own possessions at school and should not bring breakable or valuable items. We would ask you to think carefully about the appropriateness of "Designer Label" items of clothing and/or accessories for school use. In the interest of safety no jewellery or hard objects ie hair ornaments or watches should be worn by children during PE. Ear-rings, including studs, must be removed.

STATEMENT ON CHARGING AND REMISSIONS

The Governing Body recognises that a wide range of additional activities and visits, such as day trips, and visiting specialist groups etc., make a valuable contribution towards pupils' personal and social development, and are linked to the National Curriculum Programmes of Study. In order to fund these valuable activities it is necessary to ask for a voluntary contribution from parents to cover the costs. A child will not be excluded from taking part in such activities, because his/her parents are unwilling or unable to contribute. However, if there are insufficient parental contributions to cover the cost of the activity then, it will not take place. Remissions for residential visits are available. Please seek details from the Head Teacher.

SCHOOL ORGANISATION

Charles Baines Community Primary School is situated in the Lincolnshire market town of Gainsborough, 18 miles north-west of the beautiful Cathedral City of Lincoln. The school was established in 1969 and named after a local councillor, Charles Baines. It is with great pride that the legacy of this gentleman rests with the school and represents a strong link with the community of Gainsborough.

Recent improvements to the premises and internal refurbishments have created 3 new working areas in school to make this school an attractive and secure environment for children. The school enjoys extensive playing fields, two playgrounds, an environmental garden, Trim Trail and an enclosed Early Years play area. There is an attractive hall, a library, an ICT suite, a teaching kitchen as well as a staff and administration block.

The children are grouped into seven classes and enjoy a spacious learning environment with adjacent quiet rooms and shared spaces.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

A hot midday meal is available, supplied by Zena's Top Nosh. Free school meals are available on application from the school office, subject to receipt of qualifying benefits.

CHILDRENS' DRINKS POLICY

Parents of children throughout the school may order and pay for school milk. (forms available from the office) Children under 5 are provided with a daily carton of milk free of charge. Fizzy drinks and glass bottles are prohibited. At lunchtime, drinks provided by parents should be in labelled cartons or plastic containers. **WATER**: Research has recently highlighted the link between regular intakes of water and brain activity. We provide water bottles for all children. These are made available for the children to access at all times. Replacement bottles are available from the school office at £1.00 each.

SCHOOL SECURITY

The school has an electronic security door at the main entrance. There are three main entrances and exits for pupils which are locked internally. Classroom doors, on external walls, act as our fire doors. They prevent entrance from outside but provide easy exit in an emergency. **All visitors must report to the main reception entrance and sign in.** All visitors and helpers are issued with a badge for easy identification. We encourage all staff, parents and governors to challenge unidentified personnel. Any suspicious incidents must be reported to the office immediately. The school community seeks to provide a safe and happy environment for our children.



CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT

The school is committed to raising standards in the basic skills of Literacy and Numeracy. We aim also to provide a rich and varied programme of learning in other subjects. We are very proud of our residential visit provision, and value the opportunity to learn from first hand experience in different locations around the country.

Special Educational Needs (SEN)

A full copy of our policy for SEN is available from the school office.

Objectives: All children at Charles Baines study the National Curriculum. It is estimated that approximately 20% of children may experience some learning difficulties at some point during their education. We believe that there are considerable benefits for all children in catering for Special Educational Needs in the mainstream classes. Some children with Special Educational needs may, however, at times require more specialised teaching which can be better provided within a small group or 1:1 situation away from the main classroom.

The School's Provision for Special Educational Needs:

Our Special Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO) is: Miss Z Rose Our Special Educational Needs Governor is: Mrs T Doyle

All staff share responsibility for all children with Special Educational Needs in their classes, including those with a significantly greater learning difficulty than the majority of their peers and more able children. Children are taught in mixedability year groups. Class Teachers provide the support required for both more and less able children, largely by the provision of suitably differentiated materials. Teaching Assistants provide some in-class support and 1:1/small group support in consultation with the Class Teacher and the SENCO. We also consult appropriate outside agencies as necessary. We have a wide variety of materials within school to enable us to cater for the individual needs of our children.

Identification and Assessment:

On entry to Charles Baines, children's needs are identified through:

Discussion with parents

Medical records

Records from previous school/playgroup (where applicable)

Baseline assessments

National SATs Tests (for children from Y2 onwards)

After screening on entry all children are monitored according to the National Staged procedures of the Code of Practice. At Charles Baines we strongly believe that an equal partnership between school and parents is a vital part of the education of all children. Parents of children with Special Educational Needs can play a major part in the development of their child's learning and are asked to participate in supporting their child through a range of activities such as reading, spelling, handwriting and number work.

Finally, Special Educational Needs continue to be a priority at Charles Baines, and the provision in place was acknowledged by OFSTED as being good.

RECORDS

Records of Achievement and pupils individual targets in Literacy, Numeracy and Science are kept to show each child's progress and the curriculum areas covered. Educational records are available for you to see on request, as are copies of our school policies, planning documents, governing bodies minutes, DCSF Circular and Statutory Instruments.

REPORTING

We have three consultation opportunities each academic year. This is an opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their teacher. You will receive a report of your child's progress towards the end of each academic year. However if you have any queries or concerns then please feel free to contact the class teacher either before the start of, or at the end of the school day.

HOMEWORK

The school encourages reading at home on a regular basis. Planners can then be completed with books & comments.

Each child, on Friday, will bring home an overview of what is being taught in class during the following week. Children are then able to carry out their own research tied in with their school work. This also enables discussion about what is being taught that week.

ASSESSMENT

We continually assess children and also carry out National Curriculum Assessments at the end of Key Stage 1 and 2, in addition to completing the Foundation Stage Profiles in Reception class. The information gained from all assessments enables us to supplement our knowledge of each child's ability and encourage your child to work to their potential.
