

Salterlee - Pupil Premium 2015/16

Since September 2012 all schools have been required to publish information on their Pupil Premium funding. The Department of Education issue the Pupil Premium allocation to schools based on 'Ever 6' as of the most recent census. This funding is available for us to support children in care, adopted children, children of parents serving in the armed forces and children known to be eligible for free school meals over a six-year period.

For the period September 2015 to 31st August 2016 Salterlee Primary School received Pupil Premium funding of £5200.

Our Pupil Premium initiatives have included:

- Training and salary costs towards the creation of Learning Mentor post with a focus on attendance and behaviour support
- Purchase of equipment and to help eligible pupils achieve the targets within any relevant IEP and EHC plans
- Targeted support from Teaching Assistants to support curriculum access
- Funding of trips, visits and visitors to school in promotion of inspirational events and experiences, including the Year 5/6 and Year 3/4 residential visits
- Purchase of resources to support intervention
- Participation in a Brass Band Ensemble

In the last academic year (September 2015 to August 2016) Salterlee Primary School used its Pupil Premium funding to provide both individual and group intervention to ensure continued progress and academic achievement. This has focused on literacy and numeracy precision teaching.

Pupil Premium monitoring of impact continues with additional targeted focus on aspirational events, visitors and provision.

Children eligible for pupil premium children have the option for educational visits being funded, additional resources being purchased and free attendance at breakfast and after school club.

Impact Summary

Due to the small numbers of pupils at Salterlee who are eligible for the pupil premium, analysis of impact can only be reliably made on a case by case basis. To protect the privacy of individual children we have, in-line with DfE procedures, suppressed the publication of this information.

Next Steps

During the current academic year (September 2016 to August 2017) the school is estimated to receive £5,000 and will continue to use the Pupil Premium grant to support individual and group intervention work.

Key priorities will remain ensuring that all pupils have equal access to extra-curricular activities. Additionally, we will focus on developing more opportunities for staff to help pupils reflect on their learning.
