Year 1	<p>Well we have reached the end of a really busy term and the children are ready for a break. This week we have finished our three little pigs topic using variety of materials to build houses and then practised blowing these down. It was lots of fun! We have also finished our 2D and 3D shape unit of work. After the holidays we will start our new topic toys now and then. Year 2	<p>We have come to the end of a very busy half term and everyone is ready for a week of rest. This week we have been looking at odd and even numbers and homework is linked to this. We have finished our literacy work about The Magic Brush linked to our China topic. The children enjoyed the poetry work linked to this topic and we are going to make a display of this in our classroom. In RE we have started to look at Lent which we will continue as this starts the week we are back in school. Can you please encourage your children to use the mathematics and spellodrome programme during the holidays as they have enjoyed this in school and the work is linked to our class objectives. Year 3	<p>We have had a good week in Year 3 this week. Children have been continuing measuring length and then we have moved onto looking at mass – using g and kg. It would be really good if, over the half term, you could involve your child in some cooking or baking in order for them to have another go at measuring using these units – grams would be best, rather than lbs and oz. In Literacy, we have started to look at report writing and how we use the five w's to start our report – when, where, who, what and why. Over half term, we are not sending out homework, but we like you to read at least 4 times with your child and record in their reading record book. There is also Mathematics and Spellodrome for those children who would like to. Otherwise, we hope the children enjoy a well-earned rest and come back full of energy and hard work after the half term! We look forward to seeing you at Parent's evening when we return. Year 4	<p>Lots of hard work has been going on in Year 4 this week! We completed our literacy unit on writing non-chronological reports with the children writing their own reports based on mythical creatures that they invented. In maths, the children worked really well on subtracting fractions and then used all of their new skills to solve word problems involving fractions. After half term, we will begin a unit of work on time in maths. So, it would be really useful for the children to practice telling the time at home using their own watches! We finished the week with our last two Kidsafe sessions. In these sessions we learnt about keeping our private places safe and talking more about our trusted grown-ups. Letters were sent home after each of these sessions explaining what we talked about in more detail. Homework for over half term is to research Skara Brae; an archaeological site that has remains from a Stone Age village. The children need to present the information that they find on a poster. Please encourage your child to read at least 4 times with a grown up as well. I hope you all enjoy your half term!</p> <p>VIP: Connor Jackson</p>
Year 5	<p>What a busy week! The children have had a great week and really enjoyed their trip to the Duddon on Friday. On Monday after half term, we will be going to watch The Sound Of Music at St Bernard's School in Barrow. A separate letter has been sent home about this! Year 6	<p>We've reached the end of another half term and the children deserve a well-earned rest! What's been happening? On Monday after school Miss Mullan had her parents meeting about the forthcoming Castle Rigg Trip. Many thanks to all of the parents who attended and I hope you are all reassured about what the trip will entail. Years 5 and 6 enjoyed watching the play 'The Saga of Ernest' at the Beggar's Theatre on Wednesday afternoon, this was a free performance and we would like to thank Jakki Moore for inviting us. We had our fund raising day for JDRF (Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation) on Friday. It was great to see the children in their onesies and pyjamas. At the last count we have raised £141 which is brilliant – thank you all for supporting us and for your kind donations. Year 5 went on their rearranged River Studies trip to 'Three Shires' up in the Ulpha Valley, we are sure they will all be enjoying themselves up there! We broke up for half term today too! ☺ ☺

What's happening this week? We return to school on Monday 27th February, year 5 will be going to St Bernard's Catholic High School to watch their performance of The Sound Of Music, leaving school at 12.30pm and returning to school at about 4pm. On Tuesday morning KS1 will be sending some teams to compete in the gymnastics tournament at Millom School. Wednesday 1st March is Ash Wednesday; KS2 will be attending Mass in Church at 9.30am. KS1 will have their own service in school at 11am. Our Parents Evenings are on Wednesday 1st and Thursday 2nd March. On Thursday 2nd in the afternoon, year 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be going to The Beggars Theatre to watch a production of 'Jason and the Golden Fleece'. **Please could we ask for a donation of £2 per child for this to help us offset the cost.**

Swimming: The swimming pool is now open so the children from years 3&4 will be swimming on Wednesday's. Please be aware that Swimming is a curriculum subject and it is mandatory for all of the children to attend and so parents should always send swimming kit to school for their child. If your child is not able to go swimming please could parents send in a signed note in the morning.

Sunday Mass: We have started to attend Mass on Sunday mornings every other week; Children will be doing the readings and the offertory as well as joining in with the singing. Mrs Nicholas will be checking which children would like to and are able to attend beforehand so that readings can be given out in good time. It is lovely that the children have begun to attend Mass and it is nice that parents come along to support them too. It does mean a lot to our parish community to have the children at Mass so thank you for your support. The next date for the Children's Mass is **Sunday 12th March 2017**. Educational Welfare Officer: We now have a School Educational Welfare Officer, she is Mrs Sue Mallinson and she works for the Furness Catholic Schools, which we are part of. As you know we monitor our school attendance constantly and unfortunately lots of children are falling below our school target of 95%. We do understand that there may be legitimate reasons for the absence such as illness but we do have a duty to promote and pursue good attendance for all pupils. We will contact you to let you know if your child's attendance is between 90 – 95% and will monitor it more closely in the future. Parents of children whose attendance falls below 90% will receive letters from Mrs Mallinson inviting them to meet with her. We do have a legal responsibility to inform parents when their child's attendance drops below 90%, which is the threshold set by the local authority. Please do contact me if you wish to speak about your child's attendance.

Attendance Award: To promote good attendance in school, we have been presenting our attendance trophy each week in assembly to the class which has the highest percentage attendance for the week. You will see from the table in the above section that Reception class have become the first of our classes to achieve 100% attendance for the week, great news well done to all of them! We are starting a new attendance initiative where those children who have had 100% attendance during the half term will have their names put into a prize draw at the end of the summer term when they will have the chance to win some goodies! This half term we have 92 pupils who will have their names entered into the draw! Well done to all of these children ☺ Each of these children will have brought home their 100% attendance certificate for first half of the spring term.

Parents Evenings: Our Parents Evenings for the Spring Term will be on Wednesday 1st and Thursday 2nd March from 3.30pm – 6pm. You should have received your times home today but if not, please contact school and we can let you know your allocated time.
