SPORT PREMIUM PLAN 2016/2017

What is the Sport Premium?

The government is providing additional funding for academic years 2016 to 2017 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Moston Lane have received £9,695 in the academic year 2016/17.

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they spend the funding.

Accountability

As in previous years, from September 2016 schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

Schools will be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

How are we using the funding to benefit our children?

At Moston Lane we have again allocated the funding in 3 main areas of spending (outlined below) which have been identified as being vitally important for improving outcomes for children.

1. Continuing Professional Development (CPD)

- Professional development opportunities for the PE Coordinator and other teachers/TAs/LOs
- Providing cover to release staff for professional development in PE and sport
- Observations of teachers to ensure high quality PE provision
- Providing training for Teachers/TAs to deliver high quality sport and exercise based before and after school clubs including Change 4 Life clubs
- Manchester's new scheme of work to be purchased and introduced –audit staff and deliver training where needed

2. Resources

- New equipment and apparatus in a wide range of sports and activities
- Equipment inspections and repairs to comply with Health and Safety regulations
- Updated sports clothing and equipment for children participating in competitions and events and for sports leaders
- Lunchtime equipment purchased and training of LOs to deliver active playtime initiatives

3. Pupil Participation

- Engaging children to exercise together and enjoy sport through sports events before and after school
- Providing places for pupils in after school sports clubs and holiday clubs, developing inter school competitions and support for PE leaders
- Continuing to provide a range of sporting activities at lunchtime to increase pupils participation in sports
- Continuing to run sports activities in school and increasing pupils' participation in the Manchester PE association level 2 competitions including transport costs
- Developing young sports leaders through the play leaders programme at lunchtime
- Hiring qualified sports coaches to provide additional after schools activities for each year group for one term
- Develop young sports leaders and Change 4 Life leaders
- Increase the number of sessions and number of children attending the Change 4 Life programme and extend to parents
- Establish a Sports Council to give pupils a say in school sport provision
