

**This is Roach Vale Primary School's Publication Scheme
on information available under the Freedom of Information Act 2000**

The Governing Body is responsible for maintenance of this scheme.

1. Introduction: what a publication scheme is and why it has been developed.

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they will make public.

To do this we must produce a publication scheme, setting out:

- *The classes of information which we publish or intend to publish;*
- *The manner in which the information will be published: and*
- *Whether the information is available free of charge or on payment*

The scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. All information in our publication scheme is available in paper form and in electronic form. It is available in a range of languages.

Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example personal information.

This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner.

2. Aims and Objectives

The school aims to:

- provide a rich and caring learning environment which promotes each child's spiritual, moral, social and intellectual development, and enables all children to fulfil their potential, while preparing them for their developing role in the community.

and this publication scheme is a means of showing how we are pursuing these aims.

3. Categories of information published

The publication scheme gives you information which we currently publish (or have recently published) or which we will publish in the future. This is split into categories of information known as 'classes'. These are contained in section 6 of this scheme.

The classes of information that we undertake to make available are organised into four broad topic areas:

School Prospectus – information published in the school prospectus.

Governors' Documents

Pupils & Curriculum – information about policies that relate to pupils and the school curriculum.

School Policies and other information related to the school – information about policies that relate to the school in general.

Complaints Procedure	Statement of procedures for dealing with complaints
Performance management of staff (£)	Statement of procedures adopted by the governing body relating to the performance management of staff and the annual report of the head teacher on the effectiveness of appraisal procedures
Staff Conduct, Discipline and Grievance	Statement of procedure for regulating conduct and discipline of school staff and procedures by which staff may seek redress for grievance

Curriculum circulars and statutory instruments	Any statutory instruments, departmental circulars and administrative memoranda sent by the governing body relating to the curriculum
