Marston Thorold's Charity CE School Sports Premium Funding

The government provides Sports Premium Funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport within our school. We are proud that we offer opportunities to all our pupils to keep fit and healthy and to pursue fitness through a range of sporting opportunities.

At Marston Thorold's we will provide information on how this funding is used within our school. Schools receive funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. Funding is allocated in 2 separate payments.

In 2015/16 we had an income of £8926 and an outcome of £10,354.04. (This £1428.04 deficit was due to the Sports Premium being received in 2 instalments.)

Our Funding for 2016/17 is £8926.

Our principals, focus and provision:

- We ensure that all pupils receive at least 2 hours of quality PE each week.
- We provide access to sports coaches beyond the school day every week throughout the year for both KS1 and KS2 (the rota for coaches is available on the PE section of our website).
- We actively encourage participation by children in competitive sporting environment both inter and intra school competitions through our partnership with Terry Plumb, our School Games Organiser (SGO).
- We provide staff with training and resources to help us teach PE and sport more effectively.
- We introduce new sports and activities and encourage children to take up sport e.g. Squash, New Age Kurling, Boccia.
- We involve the least active and less confident children by running Play Leader activities at lunch breaks led by Y5/6.
- We hold an annual School Games Sports day in June.
- We purchase an outstanding programme of PE development through our partnership with Inspire+, our local network provider. This gives us access to sports coaching, leadership opportunities for children, CPD (continual professional development) for staff, inclusion of additional and new sports clubs after school, opportunities to take part in sports holiday clubs, sports development programmes for Gifted and Talented children in KS1 and KS2 and opportunities for parent volunteers to receive training. - We buy in the services of a School Games Organiser (SGO) who arranges festivals and competitions throughout the year allowing us to increase participation in festivals and sporting competitions. This year all year 6 children have represented the school in a competition / festival at least once.
- To purchase new resources to improve the quality and diversity of sport that we offer in school.

Funding Breakdown

Inspire+ Membership: £4500

The Priory Ruskin Academy SGO: £750

Inspire+ Coaches: Coaching in Autumn Term 1 = paid through Inspire+ membership package. (to date £1990 spent from 05/16 - 02/17)

Supply costs to allow staff to attend CPD and take children to competitions and festivals

Carl from Inspire+ to deliver Paralympic sports for a term to each class

Equipment: replacing old and buying new to ensure PE can be delivered using the appropriate equipment.

Total Spend as of 02.2.17 = £7618.49

Next instalment of funding is due in May 2017
