

PE Impact Report – Spring term 2017

Summary

We have had another busy six months in PE, with sports specialists in school as well as after school clubs and out of school competitions. The highlights are the huge number of children who have joined a range of different sports clubs, the massive turn out for the cross country events and Year 5 currently heading into the swimming league finals. We have also introduced the whole school to Yoga and had an exciting visit from professional football freestyler Ash Randall. Below are the individual clubs and competitions and the number of children who have taken part in activities funded from the PE grant.

Impact of clubs

After school clubs are consistently popular and are full in most instances. They are open to boys and girls, with an added KS1 and KS2 girl's football club to give more encouragement to girls to participate in a sport which is commonly mistakenly viewed as just a male sport. This echoes Sport England's 'This Girl Can!' campaign.

After school clubs are also contributing to a healthy lifestyle outside of school hours. From analyzing data about clubs that children attend outside of school, we have recognized that children already attend various football and swimming clubs outside of school. Consequently we have therefore decided to reduce the number of football clubs and prioritise hockey, rugby and cricket as there are three local clubs which children can then attend and develop their skills further. The impact of this will be shown by July 2017, after it has been implemented in the next few months.

Impact of after school competitions

Children are learning how to work as team members in a competitive environment, with determination and increasing resilience. Playing against children from local schools helps the children make links with the local community, which they may build upon in the future. After school competitions are also promoting a healthy lifestyle outside of school hours. Taking part in these leagues introduces our children to the rules of secondary school sport and ensures a high uptake of sporting opportunities when they get to secondary school (the vast majority attend Ilkley Grammar School). As the leagues are run by young leaders from IGS, this raises aspirations for our year four/five/six children. At least half of the young leaders at IGS are past Burley & Woodhead pupils.

Impact of PE Specialists in school

Specialists in school deliver PE lessons where teaching and learning is consistently high throughout school. Sports coaches have enhanced and continue to develop the skills of teachers by modelling good practice. In Key Stage 2 a specialist knowledge is often beneficial for the teaching of certain sports. Monitoring by the class teacher shows that teaching is consistently good over time.

Impact of new PE equipment - £827.15

Following ongoing equipment audits, new PE equipment is purchased which enables higher quality teaching and learning. This year varying sized balls and rackets have been purchased, which enables children of all ages and sizes to handle them. All children are able to access the PE equipment in lessons to improve and develop their skills.

Impact of Yoga Factory CPD - £250 (1 day, 2 staff members)

Two members of staff were trained on how to teach yoga to children during a day's training. The staff members then delivered their learning back to the whole of the teaching staff during a staff meeting and an inset day. The teachers passed on their knowledge and advised teachers how to implement yoga effectively. All teaching staff have introduced their class to yoga, with the addition of recently purchased yoga mats. Relaxation techniques were also taught, with ideas how to include into everyday lessons. Yoga shall continue to be taught to all classes, to further enrich the existing PE curriculum. Yoga taught as part of the school day helps to develop a child's concentration, behaviour, fitness and emotional well-being.

Impact of time allocation for PE Coordinator role/CPD - £1,450

Time allocation (1 day per half-term) enables the (part-time) PE Coordinator to be able to develop and monitor the PE curriculum across the school, in accordance with the expectations of this role.
