Grant allocation

We receive an additional sum of money directly from the Government in our delegated budget entitled Pupil Premium. For the academic year 2016 – 2017, 4% of the school population is entitled to this support.

At Templewood we have used our Pupil Premium to impact on the standards and achievements of pupils throughout the school. We have focussed on providing extra interventions, including 1:1 tuition, small group work, counselling, educational trips and activities.
