



## Pupil Premium 2016/2017

### Brief Explanation about the Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium provides funding for pupils:-

- Who have been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) at any point in the past 6 years
- Who have been continuously looked after for the past 6 months
- For children whose parent/parents are currently serving in the armed forces

Schools and Academies are held accountable for the spending of these monies and the academy should ensure that vital support is in place for the pupils who qualify to improve their academic outcomes.

### Allocation

During the Government financial year 2016/2017 (April – August) we have received £1320 for each pupil who qualifies receipt of FSM (currently 124 pupils = £163,680)

## **Early Years Pupil Premium 2016/2017**

The [Early Years pupil premium \(EYPP\)](#) is additional funding for early years settings to improve the education they provide for disadvantaged 3- and 4-year-olds. It currently pays 53p per hour per eligible pupil and is calculated and paid termly.

This year the academy received £2194 in Early Years Pupil Premium.
