

Safeguarding at Brimington Junior School

We all have a statutory duty to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. If you have any concerns about the health and safety of a child at this school or feel that something may be troubling them, you should share this information with an appropriate member of school staff straight away. Some issues eg; a child's appearance, hygiene, general behaviour, can be shared with any teacher or member of the support staff in school.




Do not worry that you may be reporting small matters – we would rather that you tell us things that turn out to be small than miss a worrying situation.

However, if you think that the matter is very serious and may relate to a child protection concern eg; physical, sexual, emotional abuse or neglect, you must talk to the people shown below immediately.

If you are unable to contact them you can ask the school office staff to find them to speak to you straight away about a confidential and urgent matter.

Any allegation or disclosure involving a member of staff or a volunteer at the school must be reported directly to the **Head of School**, unless it involves the Head of School, and then it should be reported directly to the Chair of the Governing Body.
