What is the Sports Premium?

The Sports Premium is funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Key Objectives

At Livingstone we have identified the following key objectives in using the Sports Premium Grant is to improve the quality and breadth of P.E and sports provision by

- promoting physical activity as a healthy life style option
- encouraging engagement in competitive sport
- establishing a focus on achievement outside the ‘academic’ subjects.
- Providing broader opportunities for all of our children

We encourage all children to compete whatever their standard and to find their individual talents in order to become fit healthy adults.
