Primary PE and Sport Funding 2016-17

Schools are allocated a sum of money, called the Primary PE and Sport Funding to support all children and improve the quantity, quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. The allocation is calculated according to the intake of the school, and the school must decide how best to use the money to improve the breadth and quality of PE and sport provision, including increased participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Our indicative Primary PE and Sport Funding for 2016/17 is £8,500

At St. Joseph's Catholic Primary School we have decided to use this money to:

- Employ specialist teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE
- Buy into the 'Pendle Sports Partnership'
- Employ qualified coaches to deliver in and out of school P.E sessions and encourage children to participate in a wider variety of sports
- Introduce new sports or activities
- Purchase new resources to enhance provision, including an online dance/fitness programme

Targets for 2016-17

- Increase the quantity and quality of PE Lessons so that all pupils access at least 2 hours of quality PE teaching every week
- School to participate in all events organised through the School Sports Partnership
- Increase the number of pupils accessing sport out of school
- Support and involve the least active children by encouraging participation during lunchtimes and after school clubs including 'Change4Life'

Examples of impact:

- An increase in the number of pupils taking part in after school sport
- The increase and success in both competitive school sports and in house sports
- The improvement in partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners
- Quality of overall provision to improve so that all teaching in this area is at least 'Good' or better.

In 2017/18 school will receive approximately £8,665. The school plans to continue these strategies during 2017/18.
