## PE and Sports Grant

This year the government has provided schools with an additional funding to help with the provision of Physical Education throughout schools. It is to be used as a way of maximising the impact of PE on our children's lives in Nelson Mandela School.

**To maintain and raise the achievement levels in weekly P.E lessons.**

During this year 15/16 the majority of P.E curriculum teaching will be delivered by ASPIRE. They are an outside agency who deliver a range of services to schools. This teaching will be monitored by school and regularly by ASPIRE themselves.

## **To increase levels of competitive sport in school.**

The ASPIRE teacher will also deliver clubs during the week at lunch times and after school.

These clubs will provide children across all year groups with an opportunity to take part in a range of sporting activities including some of a competitive nature.

There will also be half termly INTRA competitions that will provide opportunities for children within each year group to compete against each other.

To develop and sustain the use of P.E and sport to enhance Mathematics , when children's attainment and progress in Maths is lower than expected.

Led by ASPIRE the school will deliver a ten week programme after school to targeted children. The club, Maths on the Move, will be a combination of sporting activities and Maths challenges.

Resources from the sessions will be given to the school following the sessions, enabling the school to continue with similar activities in the future.

**To provide play equipment for Teaching Assistants to deliver a range of play/sport activities .**

During the year Teaching Assistants throughout the school will be taking part in and supporting P.E lessons that are being taught by ASPIRE. Through performance management the Teaching Assistants will then be expected to use what they have learnt to lead activities in the playground, with children at lunch times.

School will purchase a range of play equipment to support the Teaching Assistants with this.

## **To take part in and compete in a range of competitive sports.**

From being part of our School Games cluster group we will be taking part in competitions that are organised by the School Games organiser. These will be open to children across key stage two. Where possible as a school we run a club that links in with the competition that we are competing in. There will be some costs for equipment/clothing and travel costs to and from the events.

**To provide the children with an opportunity to try an new sport in their local community and have the chance to continue participating at the sport after the school sessions.**

Both year 5 classes to go to Ackers Adventure Activity Centre to complete a Rock Climbing session and a Skiing session. The centre is very close to school and the children will be encouraged to attend other sessions after the school have visited. The school will maintain close links with the centre and gather leaflets and information about times when the children can attend outside of school hours.

Total for both year five classes : £1020

To provide the opportunity to experience new sports and activities in a competitive nature which they may also be able to participate outside of school hours.  
To become more aware of world wide sporting events and to be inspired to participate in a new sport.

Children to take part in a two or three day Olympic 'Road to Rio' event. The event will consist of a whole school assembly and then have the opportunity to take part in a range of workshops, experiencing Olympic events that will include Shooting, Fencing, Handball, Cycling, Kombat, Archery and Hammer Throwing. There will also be a Paralympic workshop that will include Seated Shooting, Boccia, Wheelchair Race and Seated Volleyball.

All workshops to be led by ASPIRE.



## Olympic and Paralympic Workshops.

The cost for each workshop including all resources and coaches to lead the sessions: £399

We would require a session for each session and Paralympic workshop.

Total Cost: £1200.
