

## Travel Plan

### Overarching Aim

For the children to have a trouble free journey to school by ensuring safe access routes for all, whether travelling by vehicle or on foot.

### Successful and on-going measures taken to date

1. Star Walker scheme running with prizes given out according to the scheme and a trophy given each half-term to the class with the most walkers.
2. Star Walker reps in each class meet weekly with the PSHE coordinator.
3. Park and Stride facility from Grange Farm public house car park.
4. Footprints lead children and parents from the school across the pavement to the safe crossing zone. 'No parking' cones are put out daily to stop parking in this area.
5. Two JRSOs from Yr 5 are appointed annually to inform the school of road safety issues. They meet with the PSHE coordinator on a regular basis.
6. Parents are regularly informed of the need for safe parking in the head teacher's monthly newsletter.
7. 20mph zone signs were installed in 2008.
8. The head teacher occasionally patrols Beaufort Way and adjoining roads to talk to parents about poor, dangerous and selfish parking – warning notices are placed on windscreens.

### Other measures employed.

1. Publishing of registration plates for poor and dangerous parking.
2. Patrols by community police.
3. Children's posters warning of the dangers of bad parking displayed at both pedestrian entrances on the school fence.

### Future measures

1. The LA Highways Department to install a crossing island on the bend on Hunters Way (2010)
2. The LA Highways Department to paint a more permanent walking and crossing route on the pavements (2010)
3. Star Walker scheme to be maintained despite withdrawal of funding by the LA.
