

PE SPORTS PREMIUM

The Government is spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sports provision in primary schools over 3 academic years (2013-16). The allocation is calculated according to the intake of the school and the school must decide how best to use the money. Examples of use can include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches.
- Supporting the least active pupils by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
- Providing resources and training courses in PE and sports for teachers.
- Increasing pupils' participation in sports clubs and activities.
- Collaborating with other schools in sports initiatives.

2015/16 SSP FUNDING AT FRITHWOOD

Total funding of **£9725** was spent on the following:

- In depth and regular CPD for all teaching staff throughout the year in realPE and other aspects of PE. Funding was used to 'buy in' an expert sports coach and staff trainer.
- Links with other schools (Y10-13 Sports Leaders and Tag Rugby from Northwood School; Sports Festivals with our Hillside Network schools).
- Daily change for life type club (Heroes) run by Sadie Stuart at lunchtimes for targeted children.
- Clubs provided by outside providers ELMS, PSD and MatchPro(after school clubs 3.30-4.30 pm, breakfast clubs 8.00-8.45 am). Clubs include:

IMPACT OF SPORTS FUNDING

- 2014/15, approximately 280 pupil places taken up in breakfast, lunchtime and after-school clubs (ordinarily this would have involved about 100 pupils).
- Increase in the range of sporting clubs provided to pupils, including sports new to Frithwood.
- In depth and regular CPD training in real PE has led to an increase in confidence amongst all staff in teaching PE, enabling more children to access the high quality real PE curriculum.
