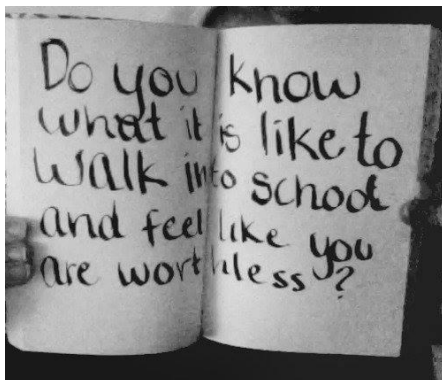




Pupil Anti-bullying Policy
