1	INTRODUCTION  JJ welcomed everyone to the meeting which was the first formal meeting since the resignation of the Chair of Governors.  Apologies had been received from Kevin Cunningham and Jayne Bravery which were accepted. No declarations of interest were made when invited.	
2	ELECTION OF CHAIR  The position of chair being vacant, nominations had previously been sought. It would be for two terms expiring at the first meeting of the autumn 2017 term. JJ confirmed she had received just the one nomination, from JN. No further nominations were forthcoming when invited. JN made to withdraw from the discussion but governors had already indicated they would like him to be chair, and this was now confirmed.  ❖ JN was elected as chair nem com  JN took the chair for the remaining items of the meeting.  VICE CHAIR ARRANGEMENT  JN thanked all for attending and gave a warm welcome to KW, the recently elected staff governor and SB, for both of whom it was their first formal meeting. 3	APPOINTMENT OF CO-OPTED GOVERNOR SB had applied to become a co-opted governor and her application and skills form had already been considered by governors and she had attended informal meetings at the school.

4	MINUTES OF LAST MEETINGS and MATTERS ARISING  The minutes of the meetings on 8 <sup>th</sup> September 2016 and 7 <sup>th</sup> July 2016 were agreed to be an accurate record and signed by JN accordingly. 5	OFSTED REPORT 5.1 Governors had already received and considered the report from Ofsted with their findings following their inspection in November. The inspection had judged the school to be GOOD. Governors were of the opinion the grade was due to HLH and staff and that the school was now well placed to continue its improvement. Another governor recalled that on the day of the debrief with the HMI the additional comments made had been very good. Governors now formally accepted the report and recommended a small social event be arranged for staff to enable governors to pass on their thanks.	HLH
	<ul> <li>HEADTEACHER REPORT</li> <li>5.2 Before moving on to this item JN drew attention to the article in the Guardian regarding the financial difficulties being faced by Carden. Governors voiced their support for HLH.</li> <li>5.3 Governors had already considered the headteacher's report. Further information was provided: <ul> <li>There were still problems with numbers on roll and the admissions policy of Brighton and Hove.</li> <li>The school needed to continue to promote itself and following the Ofsted inspection changes for September were now being considered, particularly with Nursery and Reception.</li> <li>HLH and the deputy headteacher had visited a 'beacon' nursery in Enfield and visits to many other different settings were planned with a view to gleaning best practice and ideas.</li> <li>The survey for pre-school had revealed the great desire for wraparound care as provision for this around the</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	school was low.  Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the sc	shool and its pupils, and

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- Staffing was quite static. Reception was now going to be covered by a very experienced supply teacher who has worked at the school before.
- Achievement. The FLiC assessment system is now being rolled out, with HLH and the deputy headteacher also providing training and checking consistency of use. Preliminary indications were that it was working very well.
- Phonics (an Ofsted next step for improvement area).
   As a result of work to date big improvements were expected by the end of the year.
- Maths was retained as an area for focus by the school despite Ofsted considering all was well.
- There would be a learning walk next week and HLH would advise timings so governors could attend.
- Carden was involved in several moderation schemes including in writing.
- Staff development. Maths skills were improving and further activities were planned.
- Governors were invited to attend the inset day on 1<sup>st</sup> September, am. 'Andy Cope: the art of Being Brilliant"
- The decision whether to continue with Edison at a lower scale and how to finance it was being considered. Governors made some suggestions.

5.4 Roll numbers.

Are pupils moving to local schools or out of the area? Mostly out of the area.

A governor had had excellent feedback from the prospective parents' event.

Governors noted year 2 was full. They agreed the positive impact of initiatives made by the new headteacher, which was evident from the figures quoted.

5.5 Exclusions and bullying – why are there no incidents of bullying reported? Because they are probably relationship conflict and we deal with that. We do report and have reported bullying when it occurs

Racist incidents? Nothing this term.

A governor suggested this was changed to prejudice-based incidents and this was agreed.

HLH stated and governors could confirm that incidents were treated seriously. The Ofsted inspection had not picked up anything. A governor said they used the CPOMS recording system and staff knew the children well which was one advantage of having lower numbers on roll.

The report was accepted and governors were reminded there were relevant training sessions available for them.

Another requested parents of children moving to year 3 were reminded of the situation as universal free school meals would no longer apply.	
9	Any other business  JJ presented minor amendments to the Sick Management and Disciplinary policies as requested by the Local Authority.  The amendments were approved.	JJ#
