Positives

- An excellent sporting legacy with Yorkshire Champion status in 3 different sports
- 2 hours per class PE provision and extra clubs
- Gold Mark status from Barnsley Team Activ
- A blend of games, dance and gymnastics opportunities
- Excellent links to competition networks
- Many strong links with other local schools
- An ethos/culture that commits to quality PE and fitness/health
- A legacy of excellent sporting attitudes and sportsmanship
- Good links to healthy schools/science curriculum
- A range of teams that are inclusive and competitive
- Supportive parents (travel, attendance, etc)

Next Steps

- Some teachers require enhanced training for the new PE curriculum as other staff have led PE for their class- this should be audited from September 2017 and bespoke CPD planned throughout the year starting with a twilight CPD to launch to all staff in 2017/18
- Resources are old or sparse and need to be constantly developed and refreshed- planned PE spend (termly) to refresh, add additional funds through special events and charity days

Teaching Profile

- Most teachers are relatively confident in their delivery of PE. Key Stage 2 PE is a strength and some areas, like games, are highly effective in allowing pupils to access sport of our school and to compete at a good level. Areas in need of development that are already identified are:
 - Gymnastics and dance support
 - Using equipment appropriately for gymnastics
 - Additional training for EYFS/KS1 to raise standards
 - Planning documentation in school to support teachers and their workload (improve standards of differentiation and assessment)
