Name of service

Humber NHS Foundation Trust **Integrated Specialist Public Health Nursing Service (ISPHNS)** - commissioned by East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

Service provided

ISPHNS provides a professional, public health service based on the best evidence of what works for individuals, families, groups and communities; enhancing health and reducing health inequalities through a proactive, universal service for -9 months to 19 (25years).

Applicable age group for service

-9 months to 19 (25 years)

Who is the service for (ie threshold)

There are 4 levels of service

- Community
- Universal Services
- Universal Plus
- Universal Partnership Plus

Who can refer a child or young person?

Anyone can refer to ISPHNS

Secondary School age young people can self-refer.

How do you refer?

Face to face or via telephone.

System1 task referrals by other health professionals.

Location of service

ISPHN staff are based at a number of bases across the East Riding including:

- Goole Medical Centre
- Brough Primary Care Contact Centre
- Rosedale Community Unit (Hedon)
- Beverley Health Centre
- Bridlington Medical Centre
- Pocklington Health Centre

Services will be provided across a range of venues and can include home appointments.

What happens after a referral is made?

The ISPHN (Health Visitor or School Nurse) may request more information. In conjunction with the referring practitioner, child or young person and parent/carer a plan of support will be formulated.

What happens if a child / young person is not accepted for treatment following a referral?

The referring practitioner will be informed of this by the ISPHN (Health Visitor or School Nurse) and advice will be offered in respect of where help can be sought if it is not deemed appropriate for the ISPHN service.

Information re registered service and regulatory body (if applicable)

All members of the ISPHN team are currently employed by Humber NHS Foundation Trust. All Health Visitors, School Nurse Specialist Practitioners and Public Health Nurses are registered with the Nursing and Midwifery Council. All members of the team undertake 3 yearly DBS checks.
