SCHOOLWEAR

Children wear the school colours. The uniform gives children a feeling of identity and helps towards developing a sense of unity within the school. A uniform also promotes the value of 'Respect' both for the school and for themselves.

Acceptable uniform is as follows:

- Sensible black shoes (for safety reasons – **no open toed sandals**)
- Plain grey or white ankle or knee length socks (**no trainer socks**)
- Plain tights – grey or red
- Trousers, skirts or tunics – grey
- Blouses or shirts – white
- Polo shirts – red or white
- Sweatshirts – red
- Cardigans – red or grey
- Dresses – red or white gingham or stripes
- No ear-rings other than plain matching studs
- No other jewellery is allowed
- No stick-on tattoos, make-up or nail varnish
- Plimsolls for indoor use

NB Trousers for girls as well as boys are perfectly acceptable.

Hair

Children with shoulder length hair should wear it tied back with plain hair-bands or bobbles at all times. This is for health and safety reasons (particularly with regards to helping prevent the spread of headlice).

PE and Games Kits:

- Plain black shorts and plain red 'T' shirts
- Tracksuit for outdoor activities
- Trainers for outdoor activities
- Ear studs must be removed or covered during PE and Games activities.

Please make sure that all items of clothing and footwear are named!

<u>BOOKS, BAGS AND EQUIPMENT</u>

Book bags:

Reading books should be protected and respected. To help ensure that our books are not damaged or lost when travelling between home and school we insist that **all** pupils use book bags. Book bags are also useful for transporting homework, letters and money to and from school. Please make sure that **water bottles are not put in book bags** as they have a tendency to leak. (NB. There is a charge of £5 for lost or damaged books!)

Book bags bearing the school logo can be purchased from the school office.

School Draw String Bags:

Pupils need 2 draw string bags: one for their **PE kit** and another for their **indoor shoes**.

PE kits should be brought into school at the start of each week, left on each child's peg and then taken home for kit washing at the end of the week.

Indoor shoes should be brought into school at the beginning of every term and left on each child's peg at the end of every day and taken home again at the end of each half-term.

Draw string bags featuring our school logo can be purchased from the school office.

Equipment:

Pupils do not need to bring any equipment to school as everything they need in the classroom will be provided for them.

Toys:

Toys (including football cards) should not be brought to school unless they are part of topic work or for 'show and tell'.

ROAD SAFETY

PARENTS & CARERS:

Please remember that children are your responsibility before and after school opening times. For children who travel to school without an adult this can be a long time for them to be unsupervised. For this reason children do not need to arrive at school before 8:40am.

Rules and Safety:

Please help with continuity by reinforcing the rules that we make clear and enforce during the school day. Please remind children that these rules remain in place beyond the school day and do not suddenly end when the bell goes and that they exist for their own safety.

Please pay particular attention to the following:

- Keep to footpaths and crossing points and keep off the grassy slopes near the driveway as we cannot guarantee that the school grounds will remain clear of traffic at all times.
- Keep off the steep grassy slopes near the pathway and the high brick KS2 boundary wall as a fall will cause serious injury.
- Keep off flower beds and vegetable plots to protect and preserve the plants, shrubs and vegetables that make our grounds so unique and beautiful.
- Do not ride scooters or bicycles on the school grounds (unless it is as part of a scooter or cycle safety session). Once on the school site wheel your scooter or bike to the scooter and cycle stores provided.
