

LITERACY

Through our topic work we will have opportunities to write play scripts, instructions and letters. In discrete Literacy lessons, we will explore Jeremy Strong's text *Romans on the Rampage*. Through this we will develop our comprehension skills, broaden our vocabulary, take part in class discussions and develop our ability to edit and redraft writing across a range of genres (explanation texts and newspaper report).



MATHS

Within our topic work, we will explore how to read and write Roman Numerals. Throughout discrete maths lessons, we will begin by exploring the place value of digit along with looking at the four operations of number (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) developing ways to carry these out mentally. We will also deepen our understanding of the calendar, including days, weeks, months and years.

SCIENCE

We will be developing our understanding of how animals, including humans, survive. Through this we will investigate the different food groups needed for growth and their importance. We will also look at the significance of the skeleton and muscles found in the human body.

PE

Throughout PE lessons, we will practise a range of multi skills to develop coordination. We will also have a try at different gymnastic activities whilst understanding the importance of keeping ourselves safe.

RE

We will explore what it means to be a Christian and the importance of belonging to God. We will also develop our understanding of how religious families and communities practise their faith.

COMPUTING

During this term, we will become confident with the schools acceptable use policy and the importance of SMART rules in keeping us safe online. We will learn how to keep ourselves protected by keeping personal information private and will know how to report upsetting or inappropriate information.

MUSIC

We will learn how to play the recorder with confidence and will also develop our skills in singing, notation and listening.

FRENCH

We have a specialised teacher who follows the French scheme of i-languages. They will work through the basic phrases, numbers and days of the week before moving onto more complex French.

HISTORY

We will look closely at the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. We will understand the time period during which the events took place and will develop our questioning skills by observing evidence and asking questions about the past. We will understand how significant historical figures and their achievements have contributed to our lives today.



ART/DT

We will have the opportunity to create sculptures, mosaics along with Roman jewellery. We will also work together to create shields and helmets and explore Roman foods.

WORSHIP

We will take part in daily worship to affirm the Christian Faith and knowledge of the Bible through the Anglican traditions.

GEOGRAPHY

We will make comparisons between Britain and Italy, both now and in key points from the past. Through this we will develop our mapping skills and deepen our locational knowledge of Europe. We will also explore the difference between Human and Physical geography and look at a range of examples in Italy and the United Kingdom.
