We have a safeguarding policy for staff, parents and governors. This version is for you. It will help you decide if there is a problem and tell you where to get help and support if you need it.

At Southfield Park, all the adults around you think that your health, safety and happiness are very important. We respect you and want to keep you safe. Not only do we want you to make good progress in all of your learning, we want to teach you to recognise risks in different situations and how to protect yourself and stay safe.

You can talk to you teacher, or any adult in the school if you are feeling worried about anything. However Mrs Gee, Mrs Crawford and Mrs Smith know lots about how to keep children safe and are always there to listen to any concerns or worries that you have.

Don't forget to use the worry box in your class if you don't want to say your problem out loud.

All staff and visitors to our school have to sign in at the office and wear a lanyard. If you see someone around school who isn't wearing a lanyard then you must tell a member of staff straight away.

Things that might worry you

- Has someone said something to you or have you heard something that has upset you?
- Has someone made you feel uncomfortable about how or where they have touched you?
- Has someone hit, punched, smacked or hurt you in any way?
- Has someone offered you a tablet, cigarette, or drink that you know you shouldn't have?
