## Foundation

The children in Foundation have been settling in nicely to the class and have had a wonderful time making new friends. This week we have been thinking about what makes us special. We have listened to the story of Elmer and looked at how we are similar and different to our friends in the classroom. We have used the ipads to take 'silly selfies' using filters on Photobooth and then tried to figure out who was in each photo!



## Year 1

Year 1 are settling well into their new routines. They are rapidly becoming super "learning detectives", looking for signs of learning taking place around school. We have used this information to introduce the concept of growth mind-set. They have been introduced to Crispin Crow and are already able to spot some of his mistakes when he helps us with Maths and English! On Wednesday we started our Science topic on The Body. I was really impressed at how many parts of the body, internal and external, the children could name. They drew and labelled these on a life-size picture ready for the classroom wall.



## Year 2

Year 2 have had a great start to the new year and have been welcoming new friends to the class! We have been busy thinking of all the things we want to achieve this year and have created a new class charter showing all the things we are expecting during our time in Year 2. We have also been using maths equipment to show we understand place value (tens and ones) and have met Beegu, an alien who has crashed to Earth!

In Class 3 we have welcomed a new friend and we have been busy showing him our classroom and helping him to become familiar with our routines.
