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School Sports Premium 2016-2017

School Sports Premium is money given to the schools by the Government to support the development of Sport and Physical Education in School.

Our School vision statement for Physical Education is :-

‘The school aims to provide a high quality physical education curriculum that inspires all pupils to succeed, excel and have fun in competitive sport and other physically demanding activities and by so doing embedding values such as fairness and respect.’

To achieve our vision we will aim to:-

- Provide opportunities for all our pupils to master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching as well as developing balance, agility and coordination and by so doing begin to apply these to a range of activities.
- Participate in team games, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.
- Perform dances using simple movement patterns.
- Have fun and by so doing building up skills for life so that all our children are encouraged to lead healthy, active lives.

Allocation

The allocation of School Sports Premium for 2016-2017 is £8187.00. There is unspent funding from 2015-2016 of £5687.00 giving a total of £13874.00

This year our school sports funding has been invested in on going professional development for all staff in school in to improve and progress the physical literacy of our children. Tuition for staff is being delivered by Move IQ.

Achievement in p.e.

Staff have undergone training in dance, games and gymnastics with specially trained coaches.

Health and well being

The staff have been following a planned programme of work in school with a sports coach to develop the physical literacy of all our children.

Impact

- To increase staff knowledge about what physical literacy means and its implications for the wider curriculum.
- To improve the fine motor skills of all our children and so bring about improved standards in the wider curriculum
- To improve our children`s listening skills and their understanding of being ready to learn.
- Improved behaviour and attendance.
- Improved pupils attitudes to p.e. and develop within our children a desire to continue to engage with sports activities beyond our school and in to adult life.

Forest Schools

To continue with our outdoor learning and to enable all of our children to take part in Forest Schools the cost of the mini-bus hire will be paid for from the School Sports Premium.

Lea Green

To support our visits to the Derbyshire Outdoor Learning Centre at Lea Green and to ensure our children gain the most benefit from their visit, the extra tuition fees are paid from School Sports Premium.

Wheels Week

Children will be taking part in Wheels Week in school where they can learn to ride a bike or hone their existing skills. There will also be an opportunity for children and parents to learn how to look after their bike. Provision will be supplied by 'Big on Bikes'.

Physical Literacy Programme

Move IQ will be providing staff training and resources for the progression of the physical literacy programme in school. The impact of the first sessions of the programme have been really positive with noticeable results in handwriting, especially boys.

Staff Training

Training for our staff in gymnastics, dance and games is being provided by Derby County Community Trust. They will also be providing a resource bundle to support the training.

Extra Curricular Activities

Extra curricular activities will be organised for the children throughout the year to include dance, games and gymnastics.
