

Spending the Sports Grant Funding

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The Governors agree that the money must be used in our pursuit of excellence for all children: every child will benefit from additional opportunities; our most able children will be given further opportunities which will enable them to benefit from subject specialist high level coaching so they are able to compete in advanced tournaments; in addition staff will have access to training opportunities and continued professional development.

The following shows how we spent the sports funding during 2016-2017.

- Two terms of gymnastics and athletics coaching (First for Sports) for all children in years FS2 – 6, including after school sports provision
- Four terms of specialist taught sports coaching (MNR Sports) for all children in years FS2 – 6, including after school sports provision
- Coaching for the further development of our extra-curricular gymnastics club
- Swimming subsidy to ensure every child has the experience of swimming each year.
- Fee for joining the local sports affiliation hub which gives access to 3 terms of sports coaching and tournament opportunities
- Fee for specialist taught dance lessons for all children, including the cost of the 2016 Corn Exchange Dance Choreography Challenge for children in years 4 - 6

In 2016-17 our allocation was £13,193 (including a carry forward of £4,953). The total cost for sports coaches and the Sports Affiliation fees amounted all children was £4,386. The School paid for swimming lessons for all children in the autumn term (£1,680) which meant all children could attend swimming without cost. Contributions towards our specialist dance teacher including work on our Nativity Barn Service and the School's Choreography Challenge amount to £1667.50. The new sports shed with base totalled £2050.84. Miscellaneous items amounted to £104.44.

Impact of funding

- Improved outcomes in children's achievement and attainment in gymnastics.
- Attendance at after school sports clubs this term was 75%
- Our KS1 and KS2 sports teams have competed in friendly matches with increasing success.

- Children across the school demonstrate high levels of achievement and motivation in dance. Our Enborne Primary Dance Club is one of our most popular clubs amongst the children and is attended by an increasing number of boys in KS2.

2017-18

We are continuing with our current arrangements into 2017-18 using First for Sports providing our sports coaching for one afternoon each week with after school club provision. The Park House sports affiliation will provide us access to local tournaments and competitions. We have yet to receive any funding for 2017-18.
