Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week in English, Year 3 will be writing a class story and learning to write their own versions, based on our class story, 'The papaya that spoke'.

Year 4

This coming week, Year 4 will be learning to innovate their story based on Oliver Twist. They will be looking at using challenging vocabulary to describe a new setting and will be using expanded noun phrases to enhance their writing.

Year 5

Next week in English, we will be planning and writing our own adventure story based on the text 'Sandy Cove'.

Year 6

Next week in Year 6, we will be creating our own story maps and descriptions for our narrative writing. We will be learning about how we can use cohesive devices to link the different sections of our writing together. We will also be learning about how we can use figurative language to create more in-depth detail.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week, we will be comparing and ordering numbers by recognising the most significant digit, estimating the order of 3-digit numbers and rounding numbers to the nearest tenth and hundredth.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to become fluent in addition and subtraction using both mental and formal written strategies.

Year 5

Next week in maths, Year 5 will be multiplying whole numbers and decimals by 10, 100 and 1000, then consolidating our knowledge through a range of problems.

Year 6

Next week in maths, the children will be learning to identify the value of each digit to three decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 giving answers up to three decimal places.
