

# The School Sport Premium

In April 2013 the government announced its strategy for improving the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 was set aside to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, will be allocated to primary school Headteachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

The funding for 2016/2017 was £8000 + £5 per eligible pupil aged 5+ in January census, resulting in a total funding income of £9,445.

The funding has been confirmed to extend to 2020. The funding should be used in schools to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers.
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

## The Impact of the School Sport Premium at Carden

### 2016 -2017

For each year of the funding Carden will continue to receive an amount of £8000 plus an additional £5 per pupil from the Government for the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of pupils in our school so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

As a school we believe in a holistic approach to the development of sport and physical activity for all of our pupils. It is our aim to continue to enhance the teaching and learning of physical education at Carden and also make the best use of our resources. This, in turn, will improve our provision, raise participation rates and achievement for all pupils.

We are keen to build on our current good practice and use the funding in ways that can be sustained.

PE teacher was able to attend the National PE conference.</p> <p><b>IMPACT: Staff are more confident and competent in the delivery of the curriculum and are able to work with other schools and agencies locally and nationally to improve PE and sport at Carden.</b></p>  |
|    | <p><b>Additional Sports Clubs and Subsidies (including target groups)</b></p> <p>We are now able to pay some specialist staff and coaches to run additional clubs after school and specifically targeted groups of children who are keen to participate in a new activity or who are not normally involved. This year we have paid for the Russell Martin Acedemy to run both girls and boys football clubs. Over the past two terms we have offered Change for Life, Tag Rugby, Tae kwon-do and a specialist Let's Dance teacher these are all subsidised by the SSP.</p> <p><b>IMPACT: More children now attend before and after school sports clubs and activities and target children and groups are partially or fully funded.</b></p> |
|    | <p><b>Membership - The Youth Sport Trust, The School Games and The Association of Physical Education</b></p> <p>We are now members of these professional bodies. They each require an annual membership fee which the funding can pay for and in addition it allows us to be part of the national agenda relating to PE and School Sport and access additional training.</p> <p><b>IMPACT: Better information around the national PE agenda and involvement in school, local and national projects.</b></p>   |
|  | <p><b>Additional Opportunitites</b></p> <p>We are able to provide school trips each year to national sports grounds and competitions and to enable as many children as possible to be involved some of our funding is being used to subsidise these trips and the costs of transport. The SSP also allows specific target children to attend sports clubs which without the funding they would not be able to do.</p> <p><b>IMPACT: The children at Carden have access to a wide range of curriculum based and additional learning opportunities both within the local area and also national and international sports venues.</b></p>  |
|  | <p><b>National sports week</b></p> <p>In June as a whole school we celebrate national sports week, the SSP funbding has helped pay for coaches to come into school to offer a range of sports such as fencing, hula-hooping, athletics and cricket. During that week the children also have external visits at a climbing wall, local cricket grounds and a day learning lifesaving skills on the beach. Each year group (Y1-6) have access to at least 4 hours sport that week.</p> <p><b>IMPACT: The children get to experience range of different sports and take part in a national event throughout the week, encouraging them to join school or community sports clubs.</b></p>   |
|  | <p><b>Gross motor skills</b></p> <p>This year Nursery and Reception spent a large amount on additional equipment for their shared play areas to support their development of gross motor skills.</p>  |

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| <p><b>IMPACT: The climbing frames, balance boards and beams have been a great addition to the children's outdoor areas and will help teachers in developing their gross motor skills.</b></p> |
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***In addition, we are still the only Primary school in the South East to hold all three national awards - The Gold School Games Mark, The Gold Youth Sport Trust Award and the Distinction from AfPE for PE and School Sport. This demonstrates the schools commitment to Physical Education, Sport and healthy active lifestyles for all the children.***

## **Action Plan for the School Sport Premium at Carden**

### **2017 -2018**

Following successes of previous years the specialist PE teacher has undertaken a review of the curriculum and the offer available to all the children across the school. In light of this the following is planned for this years spending:

- *Continued investment in the professional development of the staff at our school to enable them to deliver a varied, broad and balanced PE curriculum, sports clubs and competitive events for the children across the school.*
- *Subsidise sports clubs and provide places for specific children in consultation with parents/carers/class teacher/PE teacher/Headteacher as appropriate.*
- *Continued involvement in local School Games competition organised by the School Games organiser.*
- *Continued organisation of local tournaments hosted Carden and other local schools.*
- *Subsidise transport costs to local events and competitions.*
- *Fund Year 5 trip to The AMEX Stadium for English work based on writing an persuasive argument and also reporting on the trip.*
- *Continue to deliver the 'National School Sports Week' and an enhanced programmed of physical activities and opportunities for the 1 hour a day offer during this week.*
- *Support reception and nursery further in their development of their gross motor skills areas and equipment.*

A review will be carried out during the summer term as part of the academic year review to assess the impact of the School Sport Premium this year. This will take into account children's progress, their confidence and competence in different activity areas and also characteristics such as self-esteem and healthy active lifestyles. We will look at the breadth and depth of the curriculum on offer and also the amount of children participating in clubs, teams and competitions.
