3-5 Year Strategic Plan 2017-2022



Key Priorities

1. To expand the school, its capacity and sustainability

- a. To grow to **50+ pupils per year** group to allow 2 financially viable fixed classes per year.
- b. To ensure that **unequivocal and persistent emphasis** is placed upon **quality first teaching** so that all pupils are able to achieve their full potential within the classroom and ensure that **outcomes continually** and **consistently improve** for **all pupils**.
- c. Adopt and implement the **Growth Mindset** idea in order to **maximise pupil outcomes** and **self-confidence** and **resilience**.
- d. Carefully **asses** the ways in which we **spend Pupil Premium** to ensure maximum benefit to the children and school, including assessing viability of **specialised teachers**.
- e. Continue to **develop staff teams** to **increase capacity**. Maths and English team are established, the **foundation team, Inclusion & pastoral team and Admin & Site team** now need to **develop and grow**.

2. To enhance the broad and balanced curriculum offer

- a. To improve maths teaching across the school by introducing the maths mastery approach from Year 1.
- b. To improve the **science teaching** within school by looking at a possible **secondment** of a **Secondary Science** teacher with an emphasis on Upper Key Stage 2.
- c. To improve the **teaching of computing** across the school by applying for **capital funding** to enable the school to buy a laptop trolley, and by enquiring about staff training to enable them to competently and confidently teach the **new computing curriculum**.

- d. To develop a model of 'learning beyond the classroom' so that children have the opportunity to develop skills to help develop confidence, resilience, perseverance and the ability to problem solve.
- e. To develop the **music** on offer by seeking funding for a **purpose built music studio** and **increasing the peripatetic** music tuition offered to pupils during school.
- f. To develop **outdoor learning** by seeking external funding for **Forest Schools**
- g. To look into the viability and budgetary implications of improving the quality of teaching foundation subjects through the **International Primary Curriculum**.

3. To put the school at the heart of the community

- a. To begin **hiring out** parts of the school, including the **hall** and the **field** to the community and outside organisations. To hire out the field we will look at the feasibility of putting **toilets** on the field, this will make it a self-contained let.
- b. To create a **community information centre**, that includes a library and computers, this would be open to the community at the beginning and end of the school day. The centre to be created by **covering** the '**quad**' area.
- c. To ensure that we are able to either **signpost or provide before and after school care**.
- d. To look into the viability and cost effectiveness of running **our own school kitchen**. To continue offering **family lunches** once a month and to investigate the possibility of opening the **kitchen up to meals for the elderly in the community once a month**.
- e. To investigate the viability of holding a **holiday/sports club** during the holidays to **assist parents** with **childcare** during non-school time.
- f. To investigate the possibility of housing **a nursery on site**.
