

Pupil Premium at Fairholme School

2017-18

Fairholme School has been allocated £260,040 of Pupil Premium funding.

Music Tuition in KS2 -

£5,000

Provision of teachers and instruments to give all children access to the opportunity to learn an instrument.

Family Engagement Officer - £12,000

To work with disadvantaged families and children – mentoring and family support.

Phonics in KS1- £15,000

Provision of TA support to ensure children are able to be taught in small groups appropriate to their phase.

Additional TA's -

£23,000

Targeted support for children with Speech and Language needs or children who need additional nurturing.



TA support - £137,000

Each year group has teaching assistant time to provide support in lessons and intervention groups for targeted children.

Additional Literacy and

Numeracy resources -

£5,000

Ensuring resources are up to date and accessible for all children

Additional EYP support - £20,000

To support in KS1 to provide interventions in afternoons.

After School Clubs -

£10,000

After school clubs are free to all Pupil Premium

Trips, Rewards and Incentives - £5,000

To subsidise trips to make them more affordable. To provide rewards and incentives for children across school.

Free Milk - £3,000

Provided for all FSM

BEST Team - £10,000

Small group interventions for children with a range of needs

Family Support Worker £5,000 –

Providing support for vulnerable families, both in school and in the home.

Play Therapy - £10,000

Individual or family support for identified children.

Pupil Premium Reporting to Parents

Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or group of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at any one time.
- Note: the school has anything between a quarter and a third of its pupils registered for free school meals over a period of time across the three school phases.

Provision

The range of provision the Governors may consider include:

- Providing small group work with an experienced member of staff focussed on overcoming gaps in learning.
- 1-1 support.
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through trained staff or external agencies.
- Additional resources to provide increased learning opportunities.

All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress moving children to at least age related expectations.

- Pupil premium resources may also be used to target able children on FSM
- The Governors of the school will publish information on how they have used their Pupil Premium Grant to address the issue of 'diminishing the difference', for socially disadvantaged pupils.
