<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Competitive sports are enjoyed by all children in the school through house competitions.• Competitive sports involving other schools are enjoyed by a greater number of children.• Children are encouraged to pursue sport outside school at local clubs and to use the skills learnt in school at club level through liaisons with outside agencies.• Extended swimming lesson for all children to ensure more child pass the national expectations and overall all children achieve a higher standard within swimming. • All children engage in additional PE and sporting activities.• Children are introduced to new sports and gain skills in these that will benefit them in the future e.g. skipping, tennis.• Children develop new skills at an earlier age. • Staff receive CPD that will ensure that the work done by the SSP is sustainable.

Impact on pupils' participation:	<p>Children in Key stage 2 were involved in sporting competitions, fostering qualities of competitiveness, sportsmanship and team spirit whilst developing skills and engaging in healthy activities.</p> <p>Whole school sports day held at Spring Hall – The Bolton Brow Games, every child participated and worked with peers across the school.</p>

<p>Impact on pupils' attainment:</p>	<p>Staff from every year group from Year 1 to 6 received dance CPD through team teaching and support from a professional, raising attainment in dance across all year groups involved. Very positive feedback from staff and children.</p> <p>90% of Year 5 pupils achieved the 25metre expected standard. By extending the sessions we are committed to continue to raise every year.</p> <p>Specialised coach worked with children and staff in Year 6 to promote healthy and active lifestyles.</p>
<p>How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:</p>	<p>Children encouraged to participate in inter and intra-house competitions.</p> <p>Extra swimming given to raise attainment of children not achieving the standard set for swimming.</p> <p>We ensured all OOSH clubs were active and appealing to children, and targeted children we felt would benefit by attending.</p> <p>All children are timetabled to use forest school on a half/termly basis.</p>
<p>How the school will sustain the improvements:</p>	<p>Ensure the RealPE scheme is used effectively by all staff.</p> <p>Continue out links with the Sowerby Bridge Sporting cluster and hopefully the Calderdale School Sports Programme.</p> <p>Continue the extended swimming sessions and arrange additional sessions for Year 3 in the summer term.</p> <p>Find ways to encourage children to engage in more focused activities during playtimes.</p> <p>Hold an annual skipping day to maintain interest and challenge.</p>
