Scaled scores KS2 2017

A big well done to the children at St. Johns whose average scaled scores were higher than national in all areas.

Reading average scaled score 107 compared to national of 104

Maths average scaled score 109 compared to national of 104

Spelling, punctuation and grammar average scaled score 110 compared to national of 106

A pupil's scaled score is based on their raw score. The raw score is the total number of marks a pupil scores in a test, based on the number of questions they answered correctly. Tests are developed each year to the same specification, however, because the questions are different the difficulty of tests may vary slightly each year. This means we need to convert the raw scores pupils get in the tests into scaled scores, to ensure we can make accurate comparisons of pupil performance over time.

A scaled score of 100 will always represent the expected standard on the test. Pupils scoring at least 100 will have met the expected standard on the test.

Progress scores KS2 2017

A school's progress scores for English reading, English writing and mathematics are calculated as its pupils' average progress scores. This means that school level progress scores will be presented as positive and negative numbers either side of zero.

- A score of 0 means pupils in this school, on average, do as well at key stage 2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- A positive score means pupils in this school on average do better at key stage 2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.
