DINNER MONEY

Unfortunately the price of our school dinners is increasing from £2.00 a day to £2.10 a day.

We have tried to keep the price as low as possible for several years but due to the rising food costs, etc, we have had to implement this increase.

The cost of our school meals is still much lower than many schools who charge £2.30 a day.

From week beginning 6th November 2017, the cost for a full week will be £10.50. If your child has school meals, please send this amount in an envelope each Monday clearly labelled with your child's name. Friday Favourites will also cost £2.10. If you would like your child to have Friday Favourites next half term, please send £12.60 (6 days) in a clearly labelled envelope on the first day.
