

## Useful Phonic Websites for Parents

Children love playing these games and they really support them to recognise the sounds they have learnt and practise blending the sounds together. Make sure you select **Phase 2**.

A game where children have to sound out and blend the word on the pirate coin and decide whether it is a real word or a silly (made up) word. Real words go in the treasure chest and silly words go in the bin.

A game where children have to sound out and blend the word on the snack and decide whether it is a real word or a silly (made up) word. Bob likes to eat snacks with real words and Obb likes to eat snacks with silly words.

A game where children have to sound out and blend the word on the egg and decide whether it is a real word or a silly (made up) word. The green dragon likes to eat eggs with real words and the red dragon likes to eat eggs with silly words.

A game where children have to sound out and blend the word. There are four pictures and they have to select the one they think is right.

**Dino Eggs** - A game where children have to listen to a word and read the words written on the 3 eggs. They then have to select the egg that they think has the right word on it.

**Blending Bingo** - A game where a word is generated for your child to sound out and read. You can even print of bingo cards to go with the game that your child can mark off.

**Tell a T-Rex** - A game where a question is generated for your child to sound out and read. They then have to decide whether they think the answer is 'Yes' or 'No'. I always challenge them to explain 'Why' they think that is the correct answer.

**Teach your monster to read** is a great website and it is **free** to use, you just have to register first (it is very quick and easy to do this). It allows your child to create their own monster and play interactive games.
