Next Week in English

Year 3

In Year 3, we will be learning mental methods to solve subtraction.

This will involve using our knowledge of place value and subtracting with and without regrouping.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning our new story entitled 'The Canal'. This is a warning story and we will be learning it by heart (using actions of course!). We will ensure we fully understand the story and will learn what techniques the author has used to engage the reader. To end the week, we will be revising the way to punctuate speech correctly.

Year 5

In Year 5, we are learning the story about an alien abduction. We are going to be analysing the text contents to learn about its structure.

Year 6

Next week in Year 6, we will be creating our own settings. We will be analysing a text to identify how the author has created their setting. In classes, we will be looking at sentence structure and word choices. We will be thinking about the impact of these word choices. Classes will then create their own settings for their stories.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week in English, we will be continuing to learn our new story 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne. We shall be focusing on learning to write good beginnings and endings. We will also be learning how to use conjunctions to extend our sentences.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to apply formal addition methods with regrouping in hundreds, tens and ones causing a further thousand. We will be learning how to find missing numbers in formal written addition. We will then be revisiting formal written subtraction using decomposition.

Year 5

Year 5 will be ordering decimals up to 3 decimal places and recapping dividing and multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000.

Year 6

Next week in maths, the children will be revising the terminology common factors, common multiples and prime numbers. They will also revise performing mental calculations with larger numbers.
