Reception	<p>What a wonderful, busy week we have had in reception! In literacy we have loved our new story 'Little Red Hen'. We really enjoyed our special visit from the little red hen and finding out all about her farm. We will continue with this next week.</p> <p>In maths we have finished counting one more, one less and next week we will start 2D shape. Year 1	<p>Year 1 have made a good start with half term! We have been working on 2D and 3D shapes in class, talking about their properties; if you could help your child find examples of 2D and 3D shapes and photograph them for Tapestry that would be fantastic. In Literacy we have started a new story, 'How to Catch a Star', the children created some wonderful stories about the character and it was lovely to hear their ideas and imaginations come to life. In RE we have started our brand new topic, 'Mary our Mother' where we have been hearing about the Angel Gabriel visiting Mary. It was lovely to speak to you all at Parent's Evening and I hope you enjoyed looking through your child's books. I hope you have a lovely weekend! (PHONICS: ie, ay, ou, oy, ir, ea)</p>	VIP
Year 2	<p>This week we have been adding three single digit numbers. We have also been working with 10 more and 10 less. In literacy we have started a lost and found unit of writing. We had footprints, glitter and a suitcase left in our classroom to start this work, which proved exciting. In RE this half term our topic is Mysteries and we have been writing questions we know are difficult to answer. Our science topic 'materials' continues this half term and we are starting to look at textures.</p> <p>It was lovely to see you all at parent's evening and discuss your children. What's been happening:

On Sunday 12th November our school will be leading the prayers and singing at the Remembrance Day Mass at Our Lady & St James' RC Church. The Mass this week will be at the earlier time of 9am to allow people to go join in the town's Remembrance Day Parade to the Cenotaph. We will be going to this after Mass, if children would like to accompany us it would be lovely to have them. Letters will be sent out early in the week to ask children to join us for Mass. Families and friends are very welcome to join us for Mass as always.

Building Work

Our building work has started in our office this week; this work is due to last for approximately 16 weeks. Just to remind you - we are unable to use the Lonsdale Road entrance to school. During this time access to school for parents will be from the Queen Street gates and from the door on the right. There is a door bell on the door and we would ask that you ring this and wait a few minutes as our temporary offices are in the middle of the school so it will take a little longer for staff to come and speak to you. Children will come in and out through the Market Street gates as usual in the morning and after school. Breakfast club children will need to come in through this gate too and enter the building through the door nearest the staffroom which leads into the hall. The building work will causes disruption to our school assemblies, discos and Christmas plays, we will be in touch to let you know the alternative arrangements we have made for these things.
