

Maths

In maths, we will begin the half term by pattern sniffing. We will investigate square, cube and prime numbers and find missing numbers in a range of sequences.

We will then be exploring calculation using the operations addition, subtraction and multiplication. We will then consolidate how to use a written method for division and use all four operations when necessary to solve problems.

English

Our book during this project is 'The Best Christmas Present in the World' by Michael Morpurgo.

We will use this book to create our own narrative based on the Christmas Day Truce of 1914.

We will also be creating our own poems based around the theme of remembrance, using the poppy to create powerful imagery.

Religion

Our topic this half term in Religion is 'Justice'. We will reflect on what justice is and how injustice can affect lives across the world.

We will also research the lives of Oscar Romero and Martin Luther King who both promoted the necessity for justice in our world.

During this special time, we will consider how we proclaim the Good News by also promoting justice.

Art and DT

During our project, we will create our own battlefield landscape which depicts the horror of the war but also the hope of the poppy.

We will use a range of materials to make these landscapes 3D.

We will also be creating our own poppies using a range of materials.

Science

In Science, we are continuing our Frozen Kingdom topic for the first three weeks.

We will create our own Arctic food webs and explain how they work.

We will then learn why it is important to classify organisms before creating our own classification keys.

Computing

In computing, we will create our own WW1 propaganda posters which will be inspired by Lord Kitchener's 'Your Country Needs You' poster.

Throughout our topic, we will be conducting lots of our own independent research to find out what life was like in the trenches as well as what life was like for those left at home during the war.

Humanities

We will begin by finding out what caused the outbreak of WW1 and which alliances were formed.

We will then use photographs to inspire diary writing from the perspective of a soldier going to fight.

We will also be investigating what life was like in the trenches and also the weaponry and machinery which was used.
