 - 6th Form provision concern was raised about the lack of 6th form education in Haywards Heath. Pupils from rural locations were facing real difficulties accessing further education, and in some cases, able pupils were unable to afford the transport costs to colleges in Horsham, Brighton or Crawley. The problem was acknowledged, but Warden Park is not able to offer 6th form education at this time, unless substantial Government funding becomes available. Parents should raise their concerns with Nicholas Soames, the local MP.

- **School funding** As budgets are reduced, the school has to reduce what it can offer. All parts of school spending are scrutinized for value for money. The biggest cost within the school is staffing.
- **School trips** Details of trips that run concurrently are often released in stages it would help if all trip details are released at the same time so that pupils can make an informed decision on which trip they would prefer to take.
- Why are there 2 sides to each school year? this is a timetabling necessity.
- What does Warden Park do to create vision post GCSEs? ethos is to empower, to question, to allow pupils to develop independent learning skills, confidence for interviews, awareness of current affairs/diversity. Structures in place to allow these to flourish include debating society, learning about life curriculum, tutor time, putting life skills into lessons (but there is a lot of curriculum content to cover, which limits this option).
- **Culture of research** research at the school is ongoing to find out, for example, what difference it makes to learning if pupils are briefed in advance about the next topic they will be learning about next.
