<p><u>Attainment:</u> Improving children's attainment through a focused analysis and teaching on objectives not completely achieved in previous years to give a more secure foundation for current learning. Quality first teaching and in class differentiation with additional tuition where appropriate. Provision for children to achieve Greater Depth in learning. Staff meeting input for teachers and training in use of school data tracker for all LSAs.</p>		£30,000
<p><u>EAL:</u> Training staff in strategies to use for teaching children with English as an Additional Language (EAL) Making sure procedures for induction of children and families into the school community are in place so that communications are good and children and parents feel welcome. Provide English classes for adults and opportunities to meet with the Home-school Liaison Worker (HSLW) Implement strategies in class and through intervention and tuition.</p>		£5000
<p><u>Attendance:</u> Working with children and parents to improve time keeping and attendance. HSLW will monitor lateness and absence rigorously with the Education Welfare Officer EWO and continue to put measures in place to improve attendance.</p>		£4,500
<p><u>Children's mental health and well being</u> Continue to work with outside agencies to provide play therapy, legal support, safeguarding and time with the HSLW to help to source resources, advice and provision to help parents and children with individual cases. Provide access for all children eligible for funding to activities such as cooking, sports, clubs, supportive parent workshops in phonics, reading, writing and open doors afternoons to allow parents to come in and see their child's classroom and work.</p>		£11,980
