

Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is now an essential part of our funding and is linked to the number of children in school entitled to free school meals, Looked After Children and Forces children.

This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

In the financial year 2017/18 the school will received £37,560 in Pupil Premium funding. The table below details how the funding will be used and how the impact will be measured.
